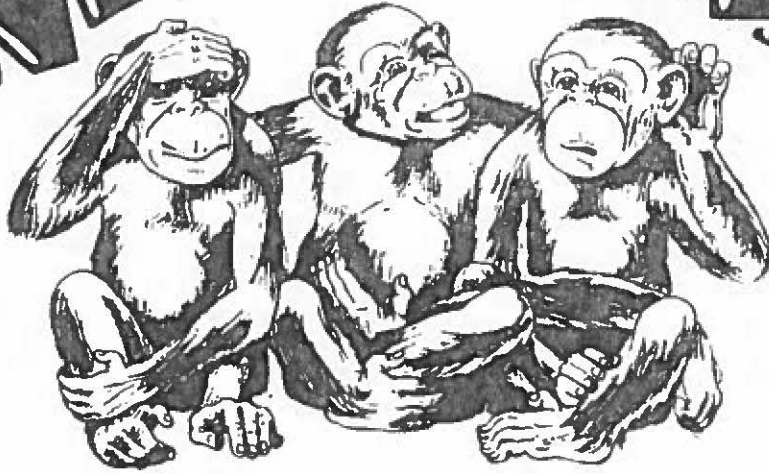

A Stamp album has just been published for Map stamps issued throughout the Country and it is said that there will be others to follow on Birds and Animals.

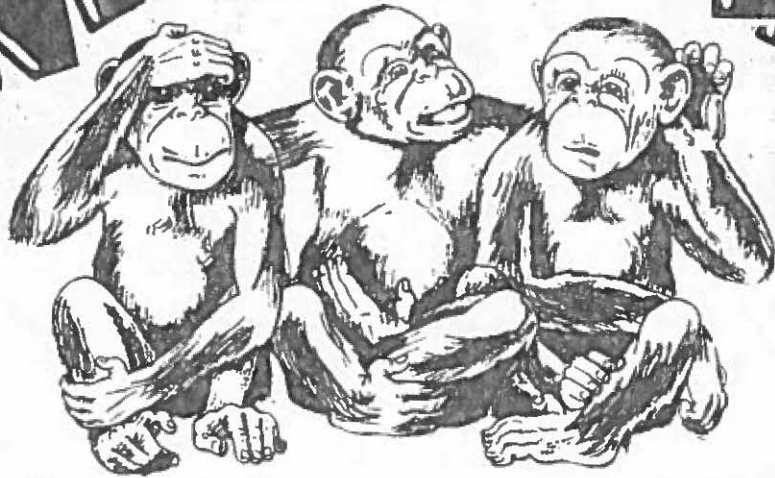
There are rumors that a 2 cent N. R. A. Stamp will be placed on sale at an early date. If you have not got your 3 cent stamp, you had better get one now.
