The Specialist makes a specialty of collecting certain Countries, Birds, Animals, Ships, Maps, Heads, Buildings and other features displayed on Stamps.


A Stamp album has just been published for Map stamps issued throughout the Country and it is said that there will be others to follow on Birds and Animals.
