# -- BOYS ON EDGE FOR THANKSGIVING GRIDIRON RATTLES -- PARENTS INVITED TO ATTEND

THAT WEST VING MCRNING, Thursday Nov. 28th, the greatest football program in the history of the R. F. C. will take place. The Owls possess a great passing attack due to the ability of Jack Wikel who throws far & accurate to the waiting hands of Eilert & Tinnes. The Gales will rely on a great running attack led by Hyordall & E. Zukowski. The 1935 Championship is at stake and watch those boys play! The Junior Division will see the Dragons & Cobras play for the 3rd straight time on a Thanksgiving morning.
