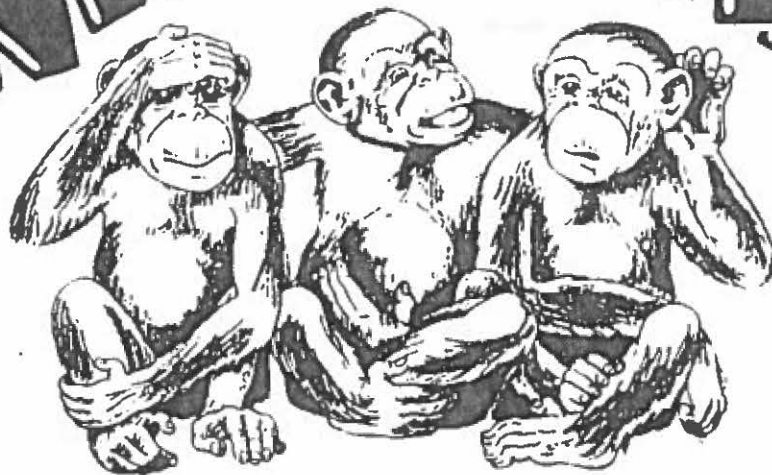

-- BOYS ON EDGE FOR THANKSGIVING GRIDIRON BATTLES -- PARENTS INVITED TO ATTEND

ON THANKSGIVING MORNING, Thursday Nov. 28th, the greatest football program in the history of the N. B. C. will take place. All the boys are on edge as the zero hour is approaching and most of the teams have been pointing for weeks to play their best game of the season on this festive morning. They are also eager to show their parents and friends the kind of play which has occupied their leisure time since the 1st of October when the 1935 Football Season opened. THIRTY teams will play football during the course of the morning and as early as 9.00 A.M. four games will be in progress. Each succeeding hour will see eight teams take over the four different Gridirons. Let's just look over the schedule for the morning and see what might be in store for the spectators in the way of thrills and excitement.

9.00 A.M. - The Tigers & Wolverines have the honor of playing the first game in the proper division. Both teams have showed a great deal of improvement lately and the game will settle a neighborhood dispute as to what team is the better. The Pontiacs & Royals, Mohawks & Whippets and Royal Jrs. & Pontiac Jrs. will also play the opening contests and judging from past games the outcomes should be a toss-up.

10.00 A.M. - The feature game of the morning will no doubt take place at this time. The Gales & Owls will take the field in a 1st place tie. The Gales won the title in 1934. The Owls possess a great passing attack due to the ability of Jack Wikel who throws far & accurate to the waiting hands of Eilert & Tinnes. The Gales will rely on a great running attack led by Hyerdall & E. Zukowski. The 1935 Championship is at stake and watch those boys play! The Junior Division will see the Dragons & Cobras play for the 3rd straight time on a Thanksgiving morning. The greatest rivalry exists between these two teams due to the fact that in 1932 both teams constituted one club then known as the Cobras. In 1933 they battled to a tie, in 34 the Cobras won and from the looks of things this will be the Dragon's year. The Hohmeier brothers for the 3rd year will supply the attack for the Dragons, while the Cobras will rely on Tideman's plunging and Hoeschen's kicking. In the Prep Division the Panthers will mix with the Falcons. The Panthers possess fine running backs in Bronold and Brenner but the line is weak. The Falcons have a great kicker & passer in C. Harris and a fine plunger in Arnold. The Panthers have plenty of spirit and don't be surprised to see them play a fine game. A feature game will take place with the 8,9,10 year old boys west of the river playing the boys east of the river. They will be known as the Reveres & Cals. (It's the All Star East-West Game.)

11.00 A.M. ROCKETS VS BULLDOGS. Two fine teams with what it takes to win the title. Both have good lines. The Bulldogs have the edge in kicking with Carl Gohl, while the Rockets have gained many victories on passes from Travers to Zygowicz. The Bulldogs have fine backs in Clark, V. Lang & Wirth, while the Rockets have the best open field runner in the League, George Travers. Soby is a great line plunger and if able to play will trouble his opponents plenty. Both teams are in a tie for first place.

BLACKHAWKS VS WILDCATS. Another battle for first place in the Junior Division. Both teams have a good line and powerful backs. Posselt is the fastest and most feared ball carrier in the Division. Besides the Wildcats have a good passing attack. The Blackhawks have a great kicker in Broecker and two good open field runners in Heitman and Berlinger. It should be a great game. The Terriers will play the Bears in the Prepper Division and it will be interesting to watch the fine blocking & running of Bob Schmackenbergh of the Terriers. Klass is a good ball carrier for the Bears. The lines are about even and so is the kicking & passing. The teams are fighting for third place & both feel confident of victory.

EAGLES VS TIGERS. The newly organized Eagles will get their football test in the N. B. C. when they play their first game against the Tigers. C. Hohmeier is the coach of the Eagles and they have been practicing hard for this game. The Tigers

-- TERRIERS UPSET '34 CHAMPIONS --

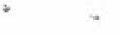
