-- TEAMS AWAIT GRIDIRON CLASHES ON THANKSGIVING DAY --

On THANKSGIVING MORNING, Thursday November 26th, the NEIGHBORHOOD BOYS CLUB will conduct their annual football program in which 400 boys will participate. Every team in the Club will be playing one of their toughest rivals and as a result the boys have been looking forward to this day since the beginning of the season. Three gridirons will be used and each hour will see six different teams taking over the field, with the first games scheduled at 9:00 A.M.

The Prop Schedule for the morning is as follows:

9:00 A.M. EAST FIELD: ROBINS VS HORNETS - Both teams got off to a slow start this season but in recent games have been playing good ball. The Robins will rely on the fine running of Bob & Wally Brossart, while the Hornets will depend on Ed & Ken Vollmar to do most of their ball carrying. When at full strength, the teams are evenly matched and are sure to put up a real fight for a victory.

WEST FIELD: MOHAWKS VS ROYALS - The Royals have a strong line and usually play a straight line smashing game, while the Mohawks are not near as powerful, but usually put up a good game due to fine playing spirit.

10:00 A.M. EAST FIELD: OWLS VS BEARS - The Owls 1935 Champs have been a very inconsistent team this season. They are up one game and down in the next, however they are still in the Title chase and a victory on that day might supply them with the pop they lack. The team will rely on a varied running attack and a fine passing game with Wikol & Kramer doing most of the receiving from Baumhart. Schroeder is their star defensive man. The Bears would not enjoy anything more than to lick the Owls and you can be sure that Liss, Pierson, Hull and Liebert will be at their best for this hard game. The Bears play a strict passing game and in their recent tilt with the Owls tried only one running play throughout the entire game.

WEST FIELD: ROCKETS VS DRAGONS - The Rockets, champions of 1935 will make a desperate effort to defeat the Dragons and remain in the race for the 1936 Championship. At present the Dragons are leading the race in the "A" Division due to their fine backs and sturdy line, and most of all on account of their fine attendance at all games. The Rockets will pin their hopes on the great plunging Soby and their fine pass receiver Kladzik.

11:00 A.M. EAST FIELD: GALES VS WOLVERINES - This is the feature battle of the morning and will decide first place in the "B" Division. The Wolverines have been in first place all season due to the great open field running of Russell Gordon and the fine pass receiving of Ed Brador, who by the way is also their best defensive player. The Gales will match the Wolverines with three fine running backs in Hyordall, Rothornal and Franklin. The kicking of Zukowski is very good and was a great factor in their recent victory over the Wolverines. The game is a toss-up and if played on a dry field, it will be a pleasure to watch those fine shifty-running backs.

WEST FIELD: PANTHERS VS BUCCANEERS - John Bronold & Bronnor of the Panthers will no doubt supply plenty of thrills in this game with their frequent long runs, which have kept their team in the race. They have a heavy line and a good kicker in Gohl. The Bucks rely mostly on power plays with Liss doing most of the plunging behind a good charging line. They have a good kicker in Paul Wisch and above all they possess a lot of pop.

12:00 Noon - TIGERS VS EAGLES - The Tigers are coasting along to a sure Championship in the "C" Division, due to their fine quarter-back Jack Vogel, who usually seems to call the right play. They have a very deceptive backfield with Jaeger and Lange doing most of the ball carrying, while on pass work Vogel usually throws long ones to Martin. The Eagles have played good ball most of the season but were usually handicapped by shortage of players. For this game they surely will be at full strength and a victory would not be surprising. They have the best pass receiver in the "C" Division in Hank Jerosch and their chief ground gainers through the line are Groth and Duellman. Hohmier does the kicking and passing and also directs the team.

ATTENTION OF ALL PLAYERS: Each game must start on the hour, so if your team is late the time of quarters will be cut. Try to have your team ready at least 15 minutes before game time. Have your line-up on the score sheet and be ready to take the field immediately following the preceding game.
