-- BOYS AWAIT THANKSGIVING GRIDIRON BATTLES --

On Thanksgiving Morning, Thursday November 25th the NEIGHBORHOOD BOYS CLUB will conduct their annual FOOTBALL DAY in which practically all of the boys in the Club will participate. As early as 9.00 A.M. three games will be in progress and on every hour six teams will replace them on the various gridirons. Let's just look over the schedule for the morning and see what might be in store for the spectators in the way of thrills and excitement.

REGULARS & JUNIORS:

9.00 A.M. east gridiron: The Mohawks will battle the Royals in the first game. The Mohawks have been playing very good lately and will rely on their heavy line to clear the way for their two powerful backs, Neumoyer & Drew.
