BOYS ON EDGE FOR THANKSGIVING GRIDIRON BATTLES PARENTS INVITED TO ATTEND

On THANKSGIVING morning, Thursday, November 24th, the NEIGHBORHOOD BOYS CLUB will conduct their eighth annual gigantic FOOTBALL DAY PROGRAM. Over 500 boys representing 34 teams have anxiously been awaiting & pointing for the hardest football battles of the year, as they know from N. B. C. tradition, it's a day on which all teams are mighty good and rise to heights whether in first or last place. Parents and also friends who attend these games further inspire the boys to play the best they know how as they are naturally aware of the fact that this is perhaps the only day on which spectators can attend and see them participate in the activity which has kept them busy since the beginning of fall. Let's go over the schedule for the morning and get a little summary on the games to be played.

SCHEDULE FOR GRIDIRON NO. 1

8.45 A.M. - ROCKETS VS COBRAS - In this first thriller of the morning, the Rockets will be gunning for their Fourth Football Championship in the last 5 years with practically the same stars that gave them their first title in 1934. The Rockets beat the Cobras in their first game this season but the Cobras got sweet revenge in the second. Which team will gain supremacy on Thursday? The Rockets will again depend on their hard smashing triple-threat fullback Soby and the fine pass receiving of Travers & Klodzik. The Cobras as usual will play a wide open game filling the air with footballs thrown from Lingg to Tom Dieschbourg and Rube Kloehler.

9.30 A.M. - TERRIERS VS OWLS - "REVENGE" will be the cry of the Owls in this game, while the Terriers will be out to make it three in a row. The Terriers have the best air attack in the League when "bullet" Connoll & Bob Schnakenberg start tossing short & long ones to the outstretched hands of Kosick & Zographos. However, the Owls will snap back with quite a passing attack of their own, when Kramer & Baumhart start throwing passes to their fighting end Muth. The Owls also have been practicing a new deceptive shift, which they claim will trouble their opponents. A Terrier victory will definitely eliminate all hopes of the Owls.

10.15 A.M. - TIGERS VS GALES - This game will be tops. Both teams have been going great and the outcome will have a definite bearing on the final Varsity Standing. The Tigers have a great backfield combination with elusive runners such as Jarosch, Brader and Prousser and with a hard charging line such as their's is, the Gales will have a real battle on their hands. To match this skill, the Gales possess the best kicker in the league in Chuck Harris and two fine broken field runners in Ed Zukowski & Ackermann. It hardly seems possible but with the return of Chuck Livingston to the line, they have added power & spirit, all of which they will need on Thursday. The Royals have an edge but the underdogs usually fight hard.

11.45 A.M. - MOHAWKS VS DODGERS - This will be a neighborhood battle of their own. The Dodgers are the dark horse team in the club and since losing their last game to the Mohawks, they have knocked the Terriers out of second place and caused the Owls a great deal of worry by recently holding a lead over them until the final minutes. Wells & Weismueller are the mainstays in their line, while O'Neil is one of the fleetest & best broken field runners in the league. Jack Howard, the high spirited back and best ground gainer in the division, will lead the Mohawks in quest of their third straight over the Dodgers. The Mohawks also possess two fine ends in Kupisch and Noumayor. Can the Dodgers upset their neighborhood rivals?

12.30 P.M. - PANTHERS VS BEARS - It's the last game of the morning but not the least important. The Panthers have not had a successful season but a victory on that day will leave a good memory. The Panthers at full strength have a good line and a real offensive threat in George Malo. Will the Bears make a successful comeback?

SCHEDULE FOR GRIDIRON NO. 2

8.45 A.M. - MIDGETS VS BRUINS - This game will test the rejuvenated Bruins' lineup. The Bruins think that they are all set now & should prove capable opponents for the luckless Midgets. The Midgets will depend on line-smasher Ed Williams and the punting & passing of Workenthion. Balazic is a good receiver and will prove very troublesome to the Bruins.

9.30 A.M. - WARRIORS VS ACES - These are the two weakest teams in the league, but Thanksgiving is another day and they'll be out there giving their very best. Jaworski is the only star of the Aces weak attack, while Dan Rowe is a tricky runner and should go for some long gains behind the good blocking of Jeske.

10.15 A.M. - RANGERS VS LIONS - In this game, the Lions will try to give the Rangers their first defeat of the season. Slingshot Sammy Ciolak, who rose to his peak last Thanksgiving will attempt to repeat his performance this year, however the strong Ranger line led by Harry Bornstein is aware of Sam's passing ability and will be rushing him plenty. Bornstein also does the kicking & passing for the Rangers in fine style, while their chief threats in the backfield are Rog Witt and Art Mueller, pony backs. The Lions running attack will be led by Lightning Buddy Rimmer.

11.00 A.M. - INDIANS VS MARINES - This will be the feature game of the Fresh Division. If the Indians win, they will accomplish what has been done only twice since the Marines entered the league in 1936. Should the Marines win, they will clinch the championship for the third straight time. The Indians will be making a last ditch stand as defeat will put them out of the running. They will pin their last hopes on swivel-hipped Dick Rothermel, best open field runner of the division and two other fine all-around stars, Neuckranz & Zukowski. The Marines will depend on the same stalwarts that have carried them to two consecutive football titles, their backfield which clicks with machine-like precision & a strong line headed by Joffers, Oliva and Cassatto.

11.45 A.M. - Knights vs Hawks - This will be a very close game as both teams are known for their power plays. To stay in the running, the Hawks need a victory. Marty Sullivan & Marmitt will attempt to crash through the Knights with a lot of help expected from Clark & Munch who take care of the passing. Bronko Curtiss is the best plunger in the league & along with him the Knights have Baldwin & Knight to lead their charging line.

12.30 A.M. - CUBS VS GIANTS - These two teams are battling for 3rd place. The Giants have a sturdy line led by Weita & a smooth backfield with Tony Krior & Lango doing the ball carrying. SCHEDULE FOR GRIDIRON NO. 3

9.00 A.M. - RAVENS VS BEARS - This is the first game in the Prepper Division. Although they are both low in the standings, they always manage to put up a hard fight. The Ravens have a fine attack led by the running of Zukowski, Fox & Sande, while the Bears depend on their passing with Schroeder & Cornell in the starring roles.
