THANKSGIVING BATTLES CLIMAX SUCCESSFUL GRID SEASON  
BOYS ARE ON EDGE AS ZERO HOUR APPROACHES

On Thursday, Thanksgiving Day, one of the best Football Programs in the history of the N. B. C. has been arranged. Each team will play their toughest rival and since the start of the season most of the teams have been pointing to be at their best for whatever team they will oppose. Starting as early as 8.00 A.M. games will be in progress and on every succeeding hour six different teams will take over the gridirons. We might say that all the boys in the entire N.B.C. are on edge awaiting the zero hour for the football battle of their lives. GRIDIRON NO. 1 - EAST FIELD

8.00 A.M. - DODGERS VS OWLS
