GRIDIRONS CLASH ON THURS.



On Thursday, Thanksgiving Day, the annual Football Classics will be held on the 3 Gridirons at Paul Revere Park. Many of the games during the past week have been called off due to the ice covered fields but warmer weather is predicted and we do not intend to cancel any Thanksgiving Day games. 14 games are scheduled starting as early as 8.00 A.M. and each succeeding hour six different teams will take over the gridirons for the battle of their lives which they have been pointing for since the start of the season. A public address system will be used to announce the line-ups, scores, and other important things. Collogo songs will be heard during the quarters and

moving pictures will be taken of various plays. Everything is all set for this gala event so now it's just up to you boys to display your real football ability. Each boy should make a special effort to bring his parents and friends out to the games as there is no better way to encourage the teams for the most thrilling encounters of the season. A synopsis of each team will show what is in store in the way of spectacular games.

GRIDIRON NO. 1

8:00 A.M. - CUBS VS ACES.

This game will have no bearing on the Regular standings, but each team wants a victory to make its season a success. The Aces are a powerful team on offense but lack defensive ability. Their captain, Johnny Neumayer, is the outstanding lineman in the entire league, and they will depend on two fine backs, Dyer and Bock, to carry them to victory. The Cubs, who have played great ball at times, have three good linemen in Puls, Jaeger, and Geyer. Their offensive star is Eddie Williams, a hard-running fullback. It will be worth losing a little sleep to come out and watch these two clubs meet.

9:00 A.M. - BUCCS VS EAGLES.

This encounter brings together two very evenly matched teams. The Fresh league, in which the Buccs, Eagles, and Pioneers play, is extremely well-balanced. In 22 games so far this season, 11 have finished in ties. The Eagles stopped the Buccs 6 to 0 in their last meeting, but the Buccs promise revenge and with their two slippery half-backs, Robinson and Cavallieri, running in their usual form, should stand a fine chance of upsetting the Eagles. The Eagles line is their strong point with Gordon and Schwoiding being stand-outs, and their backfield includes their touchdown twins, Stauch and Bloom. The winner of this game will be in a position to top the title by beating the first-place Pioneers, and so both are preparing for the battle of their lives.

10:00 A.M. - GIANTS VS RANGERS.

In this skirmish, two teams that are still very much in the running come together. The Giants are in a tie for second place and a win in this game would boost them within 2 games of the leading Hawks. The Giants hopes are pinned on a trio of deadly tacklers, Wolfram, Torp, and Langc, and on the tricky running of "Stoogo" Elenz, who combines power, speed, and deceptiveness to elude enemy tacklers. The over-dangerous Rangers have a great defensive lineman in "Rocky" Boyd, and two fine backs in Harrsch and Gogonas. Harrsch is a powerful plunger and Gogonas is a real threat once he gets into the open as he is the fastest man in the entire N. B. C. Watch his game for a real battle!

1:00 A.M. - HAWKS VS GALES.

This is the most eagerly awaited game of the day as the Hawks are undefeated and untied in 7 games, while the Gales are in second place, only two games from the top. The Hawks beat their rivals in their only other meeting of the season by a score of 1 to 2, but the Gales have improved steadily and have added several new men to their roster, and now promise to wreck the Hawks' clean slate. The second-placers' fine running attack with Baldwin and Knab doing most of the ball-carrying should worry the Hawks a great deal, but the Hawks have a nice ground attack as well as a passing game, and they hope to outscore the Gales. The Hawks' backfield threats are Sullivan, Trmitt, and Munch with Sullivan also throwing some nice passes to the ends, Clark and Zimmorman. A scoring duel is anticipated.

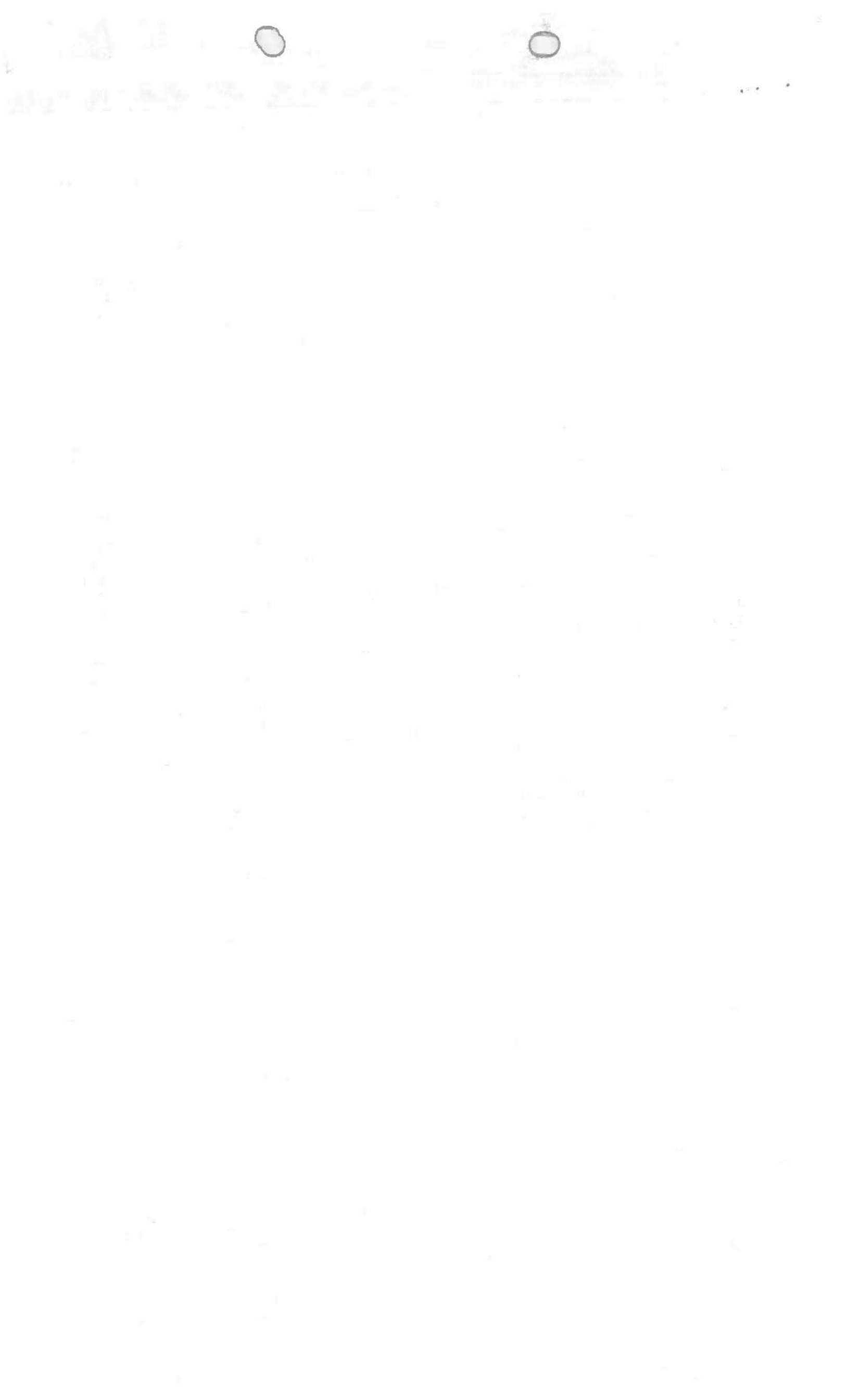
12:00 NOON - RAVENS VS TROJANS.
