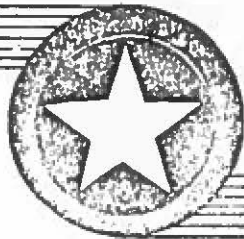

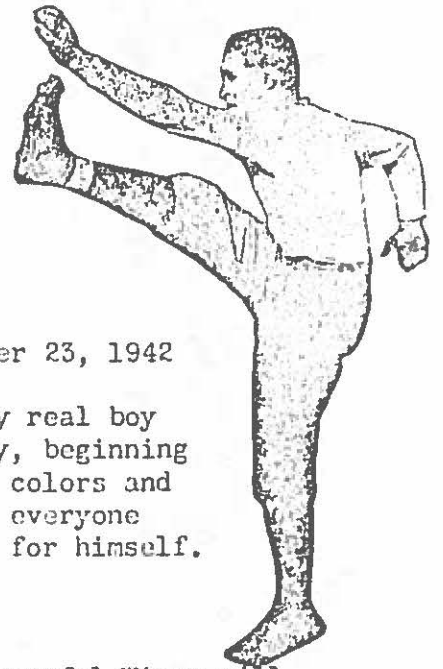

# GRID RIVALS CLASH ON THURSDAY

The most eagerly awaited day of the entire year as far as every real boy in the N.B.C. is concerned, is Thanksgiving Day. Next Thursday, beginning at 8:45 A.M. when the N.B.C. Boy Scout Troop #877 presents the colors and the Star-Spangled Banner is played anyone who doesn't know why everyone looks forward to this day can come to Paul Revere Park and see for himself. The schedule:

## FIELD #1

### 9:00 A.M. WINGS - BRAVES

In the opening game of the morning on the east gridiron, the powerful Wings will attempt to finish up their successful season by running over the Braves, who haven't been able to stop them so far. The Wings have a star-studded line-up with a heavy line and a smashing backfield. Their leading linemen are "Irish" Manning, and "Sleepy" Van Wazer, while Captain Bob Holm paces a fine quartet of backs including Johann, Fuller and Falknor. The Braves are going to battle for revenge, and they will be at full strength for the first time this season. A victory will make both them and their followers happy. Captain Bob Thommes, Carl Hattermann and Don Esser will be playing the game of their life in an attempt to shackle the Wing runners. Jackie Roberts and "Bucking Bill" Collaiane have promised to score at least once each.

### 10:00 A.M. ARMY - BUCCS

This game will be one of the feature attractions of the day with the mighty Army eleven playing a new team which has not yet tasted defeat in the N.B.C., the Buccs. On the face of their respective places in the standings, the Buccs would be favored to win, but the Army has a marvelous "Thanksgiving Day spirit" which they believe will carry them through against the Buccs, just as it did last year against the Navy. The Buccs have a hard-charging line, and a well-balanced backfield, led by Tony Greco, whose 70 yard run in the final 30 seconds beat the Sox, 12 to 7, last Monday. The Army has a light, but sturdy, line led by Eddie Lewis, who played the best game of his life and one of the finest ever seen on an N.B.C. gridiron when the Army lost, 13 to 6, to the Sox last Thursday. The Army expects its backfield to provide the margin of victory, and Lorry Nordgren and Johnny Stapleton are prepared to carry the brunt of both their offensive and defensive tactics.

### 11:00 A.M. SOX - RAVENS

The Wolves are still an unknown quantity although Sander, Tekip, and Levatino have shown their worth in the line, and Kenny Bond and Ralph Elwart can "lug the mail" when the going is tough. ### 9:00 A.M. BEARS - COBRAS

The honor of playing the first game on the southwest field goes to the Bears and Cobras. The Bears, after a slow start, have suddenly become one of the toughest

The Cobras, playing their first Thanksgiving Day game, have a smart backfield with Deharty, Mulchrone and Schurk playing heads-up ball, while Hausen leads their charging line. #### 10:00 A.M. - WILDCATS - OWLS

The two teams which have been bitter rivals for the championship of the Prepper League meet in this steam-out game. The Wildcats are at the present time  $\frac{1}{2}$  point in first place, but it is probable that the winner of this game will win the title. The Owls lack the fight shown by the Wildcats, but they have as many good players. In the Owls' line, Hoffmann, Herdegen and Porth do most of the blocking and tackling. The Owls' "Four Horsemen", Hau, Harwitz, Baumhart and Schroeder, are all able ball carriers. The Wildcats have a fine club built around Joe Milligan. Aiding him on defense are Brown and Seidler, while Davenport, Huber and Martin specialize in long touchdown sprints. This may be the best game of the day.

#### 11:00 A.M. - PLANETS - TIGERS

The Planets have smashed all their Prep opponents except the Tigers, who have handed them their only defeat and are the only team to score against their mighty line. In this thrilling match the Planets will attempt to gain revenge, while the Tigers will be striving to stay in the championship running. The Planets' strong forward wall is all set to keep the Tigers' fast backs, Stocke and Haining, under control, but they must reckon with four of the finest blockers in their division, Smith, Strantz, Cronin and the mighty "Dud" Beucher. #### 12:00 Noon - RAIDERS - TORCHES

In the backfield, Jimmy Waide and the shifty halfback who was the "star of the 1941 football season", Cliff Farrell, will do the ground gaining and help out on defense with their vicious tackling.
