SPECIAL FOOTBALL RULES FOR JUNIOR LEAGUE

The Junior League will play a combination game of tackle & touch football and the special rules are as follows:

1. The team may play with a minimum of six men in the line or a maximum of seven men in the line. A team will be permitted to play if they have at least eight men. 2. The inbounds lines shall be 10 yards. That space between the inbounds lines and the side lines from end to end lines shall be touch territory. Players carrying the ball in that territory shall be downed by a touch between the hips and ankles. Penalty for tackling in the touch zone shall be 15 yards.

5. The necessary line for first down is the third five yard line from the point of the ball on the first domn.

4. All pass plays, forward or intercepted, and all kick plays, punts, kick-offs, drop or place kicks, shall be terminated by a touch.

5. The backfield will be restricted by a weight limit.

6. The game shall be 52 minutes divided into four quarters of 8 minutes each. The game must start within 20 minutes of the scheduled time or a forfelt mey be declared Against the offending team. 7. Each setive are the play at least
