THANKSGIVING DAY FOOTBALL CLASSIC

Games start at 9 a. m.

On Thursday, November 25th, the annual Thanksgiving Day Football Classics will be held on the three gridirons at Paul Revere Park. Games will be in progress at 9:00 A.M. and on every succeeding hour six different teams will take over the fields of battle. Each team will play one of their toughest rivals and since the start of the season the boys have been pointing to be at their best for these important games; they are now awaiting the zero hour to play the game of their lives. Each team is anxiously looking forward to having a good crowd attend their game and we hope that the parents and many friends of the boys will make this a reality. A public address system will be used to announce the starting lineups, the final scores, and the highlights of the various games. College songs between the quarters will add to the color of this great football spectacle. Everything has been done to make this one of the outstanding events of the year and now it's up to you boys to do your best. Get your team ready to play at least 1/2 hour before the scheduled time so your starting line-ups can be announced. Captains of the various teams are requested to bring their line-ups to the rear door of the fieldhouse where they will be officially recorded. Let's take a look at the schedule of the morning and see what is in store in the way of thrilling games.

GRIDIRON #1

9:00 A.M. - OWLS VS SEA BEES: In the opening contest of the day on the east gridiron, the Owls will battle the much improved Sea Bees. Although the latter team has not won a game as yet in the Prep League, its power was shown by a two-touchdown defeat of the Navy on Armistice Day. The Owls have won only a few games, and they, as well as their rivals, would welcome a Thanksgiving Day victory. Capt. Ronnie Marwitz is the backbone of the Owls, being a fine passer and a hard runner, while Jerry Baumhart's punting may keep the Sea Bees from their opponent's goal line. Heerdegen, Hoffman, and Schroeder are best defensively for the Owls, while the main cogs in the Sea Bees line are Donner, Olson, and Waldsmith. Although their running attack is not up to par, the "Sailors" passing is super with Madall hurling "bullets" to Donner.

10:00 A.M. - COMETS VS REDSKINS: With four teams definitely having a swell chance to cop the Junior League crown, the second-place Comets meet the up-and-coming Redskins. The "Injuns" have dropped only two games since entering the club. Their line, led by "Big John" Kornacker, outshines that of the Comets, while Howie Ullrich and Fred Fritz play well both on offense and defense. The Comets' Bill Joost, assisted by backs Turschman, Mullen, and Klauck, may make some long gains if he gets the needed blocking from Bill Gleason and "Red" Brandlein. The second-placers also possess a good passing-catching end in "Red" Wolff, who will see plenty of action.

11:00 A.M. - BRAVES VS FALCONS: First place in the Junior Division race will be the goal of the Falcons as they meet the league-leading Braves. This game is sure to be a battle between the Falcons superior line and the first-placers hard-hitting backfield. With Hank Asberli, Wally Berggren, Rich Krey, Dick Pellegrini, Ches Mulbert, and George Klockgeter to harass them, Bob Ketter and Jack Roberts, the Braves star backs, will not have much time to "get up steam" for their hard line smashes. If this happens, the "Redmen" will rely on Ketter's arm and Bob Hutmacher's pass catching ability to bring home the bacon, although Larry Quinn and Louie Walters are strong linemen. Under the leadership of Bob Procanier, the Falcons' backs, among whom Ray Frasier is outstanding, will be out to make several scores. This may be a high scoring game. Watch it!

2:00 NOON - WILDCATS VS RANGERS: - Although both these teams are out of the Prep League battle for first place, the third place spot will be occupied by one of them at the end of the season. This game will probably decide which group that will be. Neither team has much of a ground offensive, but when it comes to passing, it's a different story. Jerry Dwyer tucks to "Daisy" Daynor and Bill Caesar for the Rangers, while the "Cats" passer, and kicker, too, is Joe Milligan. Marty Seidler, Bob Davenport, Russ Brown, and Erv Huber will be all out to snatch Joe's throws. Both teams are stocked with defensive stars, so look for a break

GRIDIRON #2

10:00 A.M. - HAWKS VS FEEDERS - The opening Thanksgiving Day game on field 2 should eventually determine which team will cop 3rd place honors in the Prepper "A" league. The Feeders will be on the gridiron with confidence due to their last victory over the Hawks, but the Hawks can boast beating the Navy in its only loss of the season, will enter with equal assurance. Big threats of the Feeders will be Koeragen and Capt. Bob Bierman who may get together for a successful aerial attack. The defensive ability of the Feeders will center around Lincke, one and Stauber. However, the Hawks should gain plenty of yardage when Taylor carries the pack behind the expert blocking of Strantz and Haining. Despite the drive of their opponents the Hawk linemen, Cody, Smith and the Larson bros., certainly won't be outdone.

11:00 A.M. - RAIDERS VS BEARS - Weakened by the loss of end Bob Mergens, the Prep League leader the Raiders, take on their closest rivals in the second game of the day on this gridiron. The Bears tagged the Raiders with their only defeat this season, and they believe that they can do it again. Davis and Gartner are the targets for Doc Peter's passes, while Ronnie Witt and other aerial threats provide the only running power the Bears can present. The Raiders have a powerful offensive and a deceptive set of backs. Led by Capt. "Sparky" Aden, their line includes such backs as Bob Schaeffer and "Musie" Swanson, with Larry Schlink and Don Kohlrust ably holding down the ends. Ray Bronold, Bob Simmons, Tom Mader, and Ronnie Wirtz make up the smoothest backfield field in the Prep League. This will be one of the best games of the day.

11:00 A.M. - NAVY VS CADETS - When the Navy & Cadets trudge off the field at 12 noon after an hour of battling, the championship of the Prepper "A" will have been determined. The main offensive threat of the Cadets will be the league's No. 1 runner "Sonny" Cardamon, assisted by Bert Tompkins and John Moeller with Jack Shanahan leading the blocking department. In the Navy line, which is "plenty powerful" Forrest, Johnson, Ditter, and Wendt will star. But the Navy won't be caught short handed. "Old Reliable" Fred Stoesser should get off with a number of long runs. Two other outstanding backs, Tom Dwyer and Ron Riefenberg, will run well behind the great blocking of Capt. Elden Wenstrom. In the solid forward wall of the Navy will be found Horner, Grund, and Weber who could keep out a team of mules. The score should look like that of a basketball game.

12:00 NOON - HORNETS VS DAGGERS - A neighborhood rivalry will be on display at noon when the Prep League Hornets meet the Prepper "A" Daggers. Neither of these teams has done well during the regular season, but both teams will be hard fighting when they meet their neighbors. Capt. Don Shoard and Erhardt Deuschle will be good for plenty of ground behind linemen, Ed Martin, Kiepitsch, and Slimmer. Chief linemen for the Dagger eleven will be Fredrick and Schritz. Mike Lucarelli and Ed Brink will carry well behind the blocking of Capt. Lindstrom. A victory for the Daggers on this day will make their season a success.

GRIDIRON #3

10:00 A.M. - PIRATES VS ACES - After an uncertain season as far as standings are concerned the Pirates and Aces will meet in the opening game on the "little" field to determine the championship of Prepper "B". The Pirates, as usual, will feature their backfield stars, Dick Koopman, Mike Lally, and Don Koopman. Their line play will be centered around Koehler, Bob Decker and Bob Schnell. The Aces have a small but "plucky" backfield consisting of Frank Krantz, Jack & Ken Morrow and Ray Benziger. Their linemen Ken Holm, Gerry Modrow, and Marty Drake should be plenty capable of stopping the Pirate backs. Anything can be expected with two such outstanding teams.

11:00 A.M. - MARINES VS YANKS - The big chance for the Marines and Yanks to make this a successful season will be on Thanksgiving Day. On offense the Marines have Bob Victor, "Sandy" Silcroft, and Ed Harwell while their strong line will consist of Chuck Kelly, Earl Reddy, Avram Hillman and Capt. Jack Harwell. The Yanks have great possibilities with Hoyt and Howar carrying the ball and Dorsch, Koehler, Nkritz, and Brock in the line. Watch these teams fight to keep from landing in the cellar.

12:00 NOON - CUBS VS WARRIORS - The well organized Cub outfit will meet a recently improved Warrior eleven at noon. The Warriors "got going" when they held the Pirates to a scoreless tie after losing 15 straight games. The Warrior line may be plenty sharp with "Chuck" Fanger, Clyde Ball, and Herb Budg playing hard. Their backfield will also look good with Mohr, Hahn and Diebold carrying the pigskin. However, the Cubs are plenty good and will be able to play their shifty ball carriers, Phelps, and the Klein brothers. Mike Sedlac will come back to block and Shoen, Knill, and Hillstrom will "Fight to Win" in the line.
