TEAMS ON EDGE AS THEY AWAIT ZERO HOURFIRST KICK-OFFS AT 8:00 A.M.

The 19TH annual THANKSGIVING DAY FOOTBALL CLASSICS of the N.B.C. will again be held at Paul Revere Park on Thursday morning. Seventeen games, which is a record high, will be played on the three gridirons, and even before the sun rises there'll be a steady stream of enthusiastic football players arriving at the park to play the first three games of the morning, scheduled to start at 8:00 o'clock -- where can you match that spirit? Thereafter every hour on the hour until 1:00 o'clock six more teams will take over the gridirons to settle a championship in their league or gain supremacy over a neighborhood rival. In the Baby, Prepper, Prep "B" and Frosh "B" leagues the top game of the morning will no doubt decide the title. Yes, there'll be plenty of fireworks in store for the many spectators on Thursday!



Special practice sessions are being held by many of the teams, and if the boys are fortunate enough to have dry fields they'll most likely be clicking better than at any other time this season. We all remember last Thanksgiving Day when all the fields were covered with several inches of snow. Particular team standings won't mean too much on Thursday, with the exception of championship battles, as the grid opponents of that day feel that a victory will even make a previously poor record look good for every kid on the team.

As usual a public address system will be used to announce the starting lineups as well as scores and highlights of the various games. College music will blast forth during the quarters and halves, and the National Anthem will be heard before each game. Officiating will be handled by N.B.C. Alumni Members, and the N.B.C. Dads will be on hand to help with the program wherever needed. After each game, the Dads will serve all the players with hot chocolate. On the gridiron approximately 500 boys will give their "all" for the team they are proud of, and we're sure that every boy on each team will live up to the "motto" of the week ---- "FIGHT TO WIN".

IMPORTANT MESSAGE TO ALL THE PLAYERS: The games WILL BE PLAYED whether it snows or rains and no matter how cold it is. This should be the best and biggest athletic event of the year -- everyone has done their share to make it so -- now it's up to all of you to put forth your best efforts in every minute of the game! Every boy should be ready to play at least 1/2 hour before the starting time so the line-ups may be announced over the loud speaker system. When the Star Spangled Banner is played before each game you should stand at attention; hold your helmet with your left hand and the other hand should be across your heart. Immediately after the National Anthem the whistle over the loud speaker will start the games. If it is cold be sure to wear long stockings and also gloves to prevent unnecessary bruises. Before entering the banquet hall for your hot drinks be sure to put on clean clothes.
