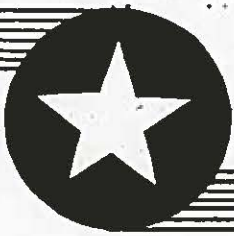

In one of the biggest of the day, the Dragons and Wasps will clash, to decide who will capture fourth place in the White Division. Both teams have had fair seasons, averaging just around .500. Last year's outatanding back, Steve Hoffman, has been stopped cold during the entire season. This has been the main reason for the Dragons inability to score. But, the Dragons have a "secret weapon" in Jim Lancaster, who specializes in recovering fumbles or stealing the ball and going for touchdowns. Jim plays tackle and has scored as many points as any Dragon player. Although the Dragons have not been a great team, they have been an interesting team just as the Wasps have been. The Dragons have a good line featuring Jim Lancaster, Ed Bubert, Joe Piscitello, Jim Schultz and Jim Caudell. They have a rather small backfield consisting of Tim Diebold, quarterback; Don Bushnell, left halfback; Chuck Piscitello, fullback; and Steve Hoffman, right halfback. Bill Woodburn alternates with Bushnell at left half and also quarterbacks occasionally. Their defense is led by Jim Lancaster and Chuck Piscitello. In the kicking department, Joe Piscitello applies his toe on kick-offs, while either Steve Hoffman or Ed Bubert do the punting. The Wasps possess a fine defense led by Greg Henning and a strong offense centered around Tommy Coppola. The Wasps line has the best balance in the league with Gordon Pieske and Tom Kaiser at ends, Bill Demlow and Doug Schroeder and Ken Viglietta at tackles, Greg Henning and Dave Brown at guards and Jim Zemanek at center. This is a fine line and could be the difference on Turkey Day. The backfield is very strong with Terry Hlavac calling the plays and fullback Tom Coppola being a triple threat man. He is a hard driver and the fastest breakaway man in the league. Along with Coppola and Hlavac in the backfield are Bill Kiesler, Al Marvin and Dan Schmidt. Schmidt and Kiesler rotate offensively but both play defense as they excel in this department. Another back who is one of the most underrated players is little John "Bird" Vogel. John is in there plugging all the time. The defensive unit is led by Greg Henning, who plays middle guard most of the time. Not many yards are gained through the middle by the opposing elevens. Other members of the defensive unit not mentioned before are John Weigelt, Bill Schneider and Jim Gulasserian. In the kicking department the Wasps may have a slight edge as Gordon Pieske on kickoffs and Tom Coppola on punts are ranked with the best in the league. The Dragons beat the Wasps earlier this year, but since then the Wasps have improved greatly. In the game which will decide the White Division championship, the "Green and Shite" Locusts will go against the powerhouse eleven of the Leathernecks. Rich Friz quarterback the Locusts from a split "T" formation. Behind him are Rich Malnati, an elusive broken field runner, Greg LaPapa, a strong running fullback and Mickey Sloan, a hard charging halfback. Friz runs the quarterback option very effectively.
