THANKSGIVING DAY GAMES CLIMAX GRID SEASON

N. B. C.'s 32ND ANNUAL THANKSGIVING DAY FOOTBALL CLASSICS will be held at Paul Revere Park on Thursday morning. Approximately 500 boys will see action on the three gridirons with three games every hour on the hour starting at 8:00 A.M. and continuing through noon. The big game at 8:00 will be between the Cardinals & Bluejays and the winners of course will be the champions. Then at 9:00 o'clock the big contest will be played between the Wasps and Hornets to decide the championship in Team Center 5's league. At 10:00 o'clock the outstanding game will match the Eagles & Bumblebees who just a few days ago were still in a hot race for first place with the Giant Stags and Cougars. At 11:00 o'clock the Giant Stags, still undefeated, will meet the 2nd place Cougars who have lost twice and tied once. The Giant Stags have tied four times, and the winner of the game will no doubt be the champions.

By 7:15 in the morning boys will converge upon the clubhouse from all directions in their colorful jerseys and helmets, determined to play their best game of the season. Fireworks galore will be in store throughout the morning for the several thousand people who'll come and go while more and more kids run onto the field for the big game to determine a championship or just settle a good neighborhood rivalry. This is the story of Thanksgiving Day for the past 32 years at N.B.C. where almost 6,000 football games have been played since the Club originated back in the fall of 1931.

Many of the teams are holding extra practice sessions for the biggest games of the year. The spirit and enthusiasm of the players is really sky rocketing now and by game time they'll probably all be in orbit. Presently the gridirons are a sea of mud, but come what may, more rain or snow, N. B. C. W I L L P L A Y!

The Club motto of the week is again "FIGHT TO WIN" and we're sure that the 500 boys on the gridirons next Thursday will give their "all" for the team they're proud of.

Alumni members will come from all parts of the city and distant suburbs to handle the games. All of these men officiated here at the Club while they were members, many of whom have made big names for themselves in the field of sports. 75 girl cheerleaders will give it all they have to spur the teams on to their greatest efforts, and after each game the N.B.C. Dads will serve hot chocolate and cake to the boys and their parents.

BIG PEP RALLY ON WEDNESDAY NIGHT

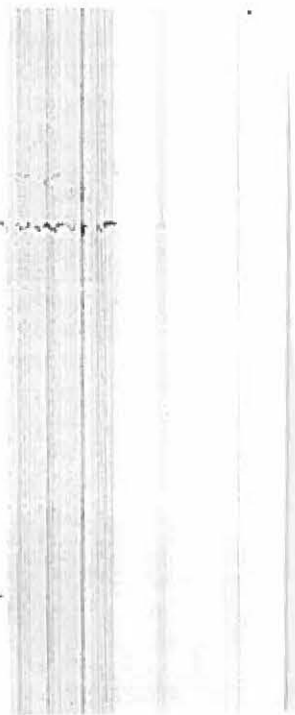

8:00 A.M. - GREEN HORNETS VS BUCCANEERS ON GRIDIRON NO. 1 - The Buccaneers battle the Green Hornets for fourth place in a contest matching offensive power against a strong defense. The Buccs, a newly formed team, have a spirited offense led by the brilliant broken field running of Al Dornan. Al possesses both speed and power, and once he reaches the defensive secondary, there's no stopping him. Opening holes for Al are center Wayne Beutin and linemen Len Trojan and Richard Auckland. Beutin is also very capable on defense and leads the rush against enemy passers. This should be interesting as the Green Hornets use mostly an aerial attack against their opponents. When the Hornets take to the air their targets are Paul Kuper, Dick Woodburn and Tom McGuire, all very capable receivers. If the situation calls for a run, the Green Hornets rely on backs Tom Checkel, Joe McHugh and the Pfeiffer brothers Pat and Mike who can always be counted on for a hard run. 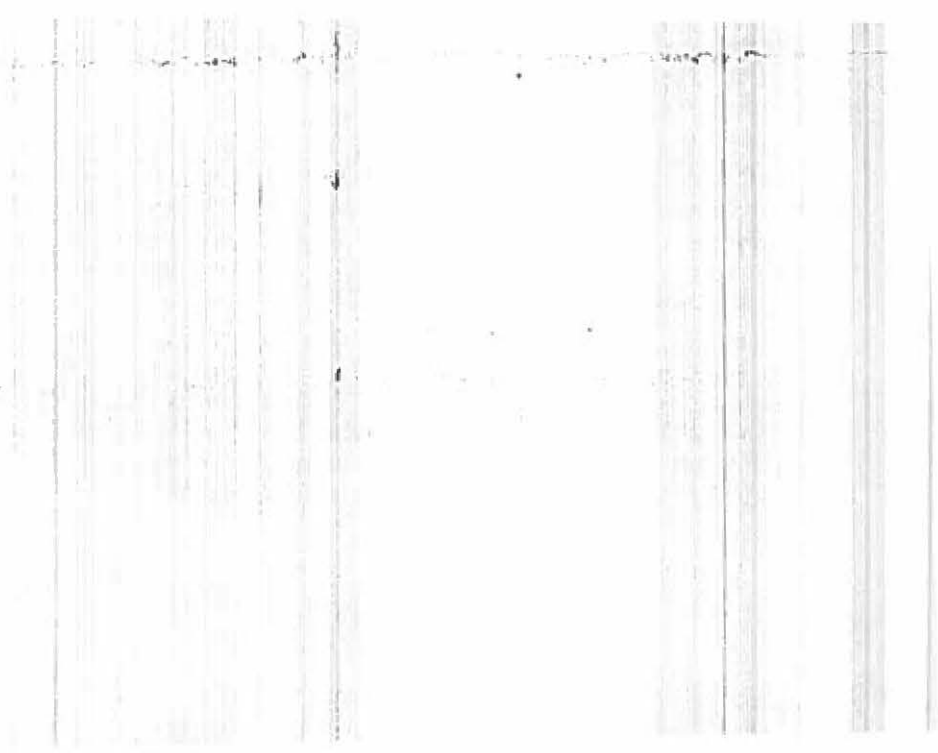
