FOOTBALL CLASSICS ON THURSDAY, THANKSGIVING DAY

3 GAMES EVERY HOUR ON THE HOUR

Our 35th Annual Thanksgiving Day Football Classics will be held at Paul Revere Park on THURSDAY, THANKSGIVING DAY, November 25th. Kick-offs for the first three games will be at 8:00 A.M. and then three games will follow every hour until the final whistle at noon.

This has always been a day of many thrills and brilliant performances. Championships will no doubt be decided in several of the leagues. In the Team League Red division the Pirates, champs of last year will meet the Tarantulas. The challengers lost only one game this season - to the Pirates. In the Blue Division of the Team League the Scorpions and Bobcats will go right down to the wire with the title at stake. In the Tribe league the big game will be between the Bobcats and Jaguars. Hundreds of boys will see action throughout the morning, and regardless of the team standings, neighborhood rivalries will spark the teams to play their best game of the year. In two of the Tribe leagues the leaders have clinched the championship and will play each other for additional honors. The teams involved, the Hawks and Wasps are both undefeated, but this year the Wasps will go all out for a victory as they lost to the Hawks last year on Thanksgiving 7 to 0. Upsets also, because of the great effort put forth, make it an interesting morning. Last year the Spiders, who had lost 18 straight games, beat the Cougars 14 to 0. In another league, the Pirates were the champions but the Wasps upset them with a terrific team effort by a score of 20 to 0. So look forward to another exciting day on Thursday!

To add to the color, more than 50 girl cheerleaders, most of whom have brothers playing, will be on hand for every game. The Kadets Color Guard and Baton Twirlers, sponsored by the Irving-Kedzie Kiwanis, will perform before the 8:00 A.M. games and the 11:00 o'clock games. Officiating will be handled by Alumni of N.B.C., and our Dads Club, several hundred strong, will be helping on the field and in the clubhouse wherever needed, and like in past years will serve refreshments to the players and parents after every game.

On Wednesday evening, November 24th, a huge Pep Rally, with enough noise to shake the clubhouse, will kick off the Classics. All Americans in each of the leagues, voted for by player opponents, officials and coaches, will be announced. Certificates of Merit will be awarded to each boy mentioned for a remembrance. High Point Attendance awards for the year will also be given out Wednesday night. Cheerleaders will lead all the rah, rahs; captains will make predictions on the outcome of the games and the dads club will award a few footballs to the boys who display the best Grid Classic posters. The rally will start promptly at 7:30 P.M.

Parking facilities have been made available by Victor-Comptometer so be sure to tell your parents. In years past, sometimes it was impossible to find parking space within a few blocks - now it's available free right next to the park and they should enter at Campbell & Byron.

IMPORTANT: Be sure to be in the clubhouse at least 1/2 hour before the starting time of your game. The clubhouse will be open at 7:00 A.M. Each team will have a separate dressing room in the clubhouse and all boys should use the east entrance. If the fields are frozen you'll be permitted to wear gloves. Also if you want a good rooting section - just remember that every player is expected to bring at least five people out to the games.
