7. A foul ball, if touched first by the catcher, and then caught after hitting the back wall or backboard is not out.

- 11. Players may steal 2nd and 3rd but not nome. In order to steal a runner must hold the base until after the pitch passes the batter.
- 12. A forfeit may be declared against the offending team if they do not have enough boys to play within 15 minutes of the time scheduled.

OTHER PARK RULES

- 1. You must come in the back door the south side of the fieldhouse.
- 2. Carry your gyms to the park; don't wear them. This is for your benefit to keep the floor clean.
- 3. Tribe leaguers may not use the gym in the evening even if there's an open hour. 4. The leaders will have lockers in the locker room downstairs.
- 5. If you have anything of value such as a watch, money, etc. check it in before the game with Gino Quilice, the new gym instructor.
- 6. Your clothes will have to remain in the locker room, however not locked until some arrangements can be made.
- 7. Boys should stay in the clubhouse if they come early. They should never come into the park building until 10 minutes before game time.
