Our 39th annual THANKSGIVING DAY FOOTBALL CLASSICS will be held at Paul Revere Park on Thursday, November 27th. Kick-offs for the first three games will be at 8:00 AM and then three games will follow every hour until the final whistle at noon.

This has always been a day of many thrills and excitement and we're looking forward to the same kind again this Thursday. Every game is important regardless of the team standings as most of the kids feel that a victory on this day is almost as good as winning the championship. In fact as years roll by, the championship might be forgotten, but the thrilling games of Thanksgiving will always be a cherished memory. FEP RALLY WEDNESDAY NIGHT

On Wednesday night a huge FEP RALLY, with enough noise to shake the clubhouse, will kick off the Classics. High Point attendance awards will be given out, and this will be the top event of the evening. The 75 cheerleaders will lead all the rah, rahs, captains will make predictions on the games, and the Dads Club will award footballs to the winners of the poster contest.

INDOOR SOFTBALL TOURNAMENT RULES

1. 11 men are allowed to play with a minimum of 7.
2. A forfeit may be declared after 15 minutes of the scheduled time.
3. All active members present must play at least 3 innings. If the 4th inning is not reached by 20 minutes before the time limit, the official will order all extra players in the game at the close of the inning in progress.
4. If a batted ball hits the back wall of the gym or the basketball backboard, the ball remains in play and the batter receives credit for a hit, even though the ball is caught before striking the floor or any other object.
5. Any batted ball that hits the side wall or ceiling in fair territory and then bounces foul will be considered a fair ball.
6. If a batted ball hits the side walls or any beams without striking the back wall it remains in play and the batter is out if the ball is caught before striking the floor.
7. A batted ball that drops into the balcony over the screen is a homerun.
8. A foul ball, if touched first by the catcher, and then caught after hitting the back wall or backboard is not out.
9. A ball may not be trapped against the wall - if it is, then it's a hit and remains in play.
10. Pitching is as fast as you can throw. Windups are not allowed, and when starting the pitch, both feet must be on the rubber or line. Only one step is allowed.
11. Players are allowed to buny. Two upshorts may be used and one deep shortstop - 11 players in all.
12. Players may steal 2nd and 3rd but not home. In order to steal, a runner must hold the base until after the pitch passes the batter.

NON-PLAYING RULES

1. The fieldhouse has all new lockers. Put your clothes and valuables in a locker assigned to your team center. The lockers will be closed 5 minutes before game time and re-opened one hour later when you are finished playing.
2. Carry your gyms to the park. Don't wear them. This is for your benefit to keep the floor clean.
3. Boys in grade school are not permitted in the fieldhouse after 6:00 P.M. unless they have a game scheduled. In that case they must leave the building right after the game.
4. Boys should stay in the clubhouse if they come early. Don't go over to the park dressing room until 10 minutes before the game.

Other rules might be added in the future.

NOTE: BE AT LEAST 1/2 HOUR EARLY FOR YOUR BIG GAME ON THURSDAY, THANKSGIVING DAY.
