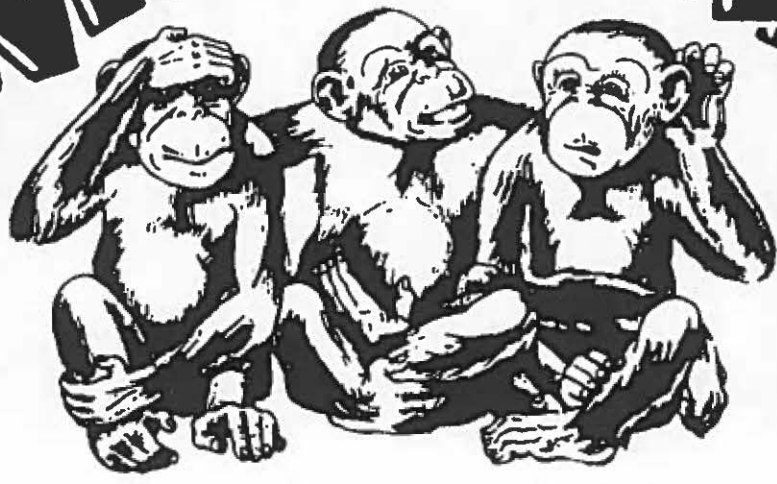

CADET PIRATES VS. LOCUSTS

The champion Pirates finished their first season with a perfect 12-0 record, and will end up playing the second place Locusts in a big Thanksgiving Day Showdown! The Locusts finished the season with a respectable 7-5 record with 4 of those losses coming at the hands of the Pirates. The two leading scorers in the league will be featured in this battle - Dean Hansen of the Pirates (193 pts) and Carl Abram of the Locusts (86 pts).

The Pirates will operate out of the I, pro-set, and split pro-set formations. Coach Hansen calls the plays, usually relying on the evasive running of Dean Hansen as well as speedy Walter Paz and Russell Lubeck. When they are in a passing situation QB Dean Hansen looks to connect with Rolando Argumedo and brother William Hansen. They have a strong offensive line led by the blocking of James Daras, Matt Manzano, Paul Wilson, Scott Nettin, Lenny Wojt, and Tony Palumbo, who provide daylight for the backs and pass protection for the QB. Kickoffs are handled by Dean Hansen and since Coach Hansen has a lot of confidence

in his team, he never punts. The offense has been sparked throughout the season by the play of Hansen, Argumedo, Paz, and Lubeck, and they've been most successful on the double reverse, QB sneak, and fake handoffs.

Another key for the Pirates has been their tough defense, led by James Daras, Paul Wilson, Tony Palumbo, and William Hansen. They have a lot of help from a quick line of Gilbert "Mousey" Ruiz, Dave Cornejo, and Matt Manzano. The team has done so well thanks to a combination of great attendance, sportsmanship, teamwork, coaching, spirit, and hard practice. Coach Hansen feels that the Locusts have been their toughest opponent because they are well-organized, and have some fast runners and big hitters. When asked who he'd like to beat the most, Coach Hansen replied, "The Locusts because they (Locust teams) have dominated in the past and we would like to create our own dynasty." The Pirates are looking to become the only undefeated and untied team at NBC this season.

The Locusts are determined to beat the Pirates in this final outing. They have lost four close games to the champs and are ready to turn the tables! The Locusts run their offense out of the T and I formations, where they've found success running sweeps and reverses. Their solid line is led by Matt Guidara, Kevin Schoenfelt, Adam Widener, Scott Yopchick, Tony Peterson, Nick Britton, Dan Scheiderich, and Tony Schroeder, and has provided plenty of QB protection as well as opening some big holes for their runners. Their backfield is founded out by the fast moving Carl Abram, powerful Adam Davis, shifty Nick Prause, and speedy Dan Scheiderich and Billy Cline. Their passing is done by big QB Adam Davis, who tries to connect with receivers Matt Guidara, Karl Haslwanter, Dan Scheiderich, and Carl Abram. Davis and Coach Haslwanter call the plays. When it comes time to kick, Matt Guidara handles the kickoffs and Adam Davis the punts. The big four who keep the offense together are Karl Haslwanter, Matt Guidara, Carl Abram, and Adam Davis.

The Locusts have also shown some outstanding defensive play, powered by linemen Nick Prause, Brian O'Keefe, Tony Peterson, Kevin Schoenfelt, Dan Scheiderich, and Karl Haslwanter. The Pirates, with their explosive offense, have been the toughest opponent for the Locusts, whose only other loss all year came at the hands of the Falcons. Coach Haslwanter feels that good attendance and teamwork have been their strong suit. When asked why his team will be victorious, Coach Haslwanter replied, "We have played 4 very close games against the Pirates. In them we have made a critical error or two that cost a touchdown. In 3 games, the Pirates scored with less than two minutes in the half on runs of 40 yards or more and then won those games by 6 points. We hope to reverse the tables on Thanksgiving." in pounding out the short yardage. Mike LeBike split his time between the backfield and the end spot. Rene Duran led the team in scoring, and Paul Sopanarat and Tony Ratana were right behind him. 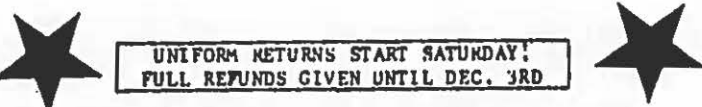

UNIFORM RETURNS START SATURDAY!
FULL REFUNDS GIVEN UNTIL DEC. 3RD

Players must return NRC's football uniform for a refund between SATURDAY, NOV. 26TH AND SATURDAY, DEC. 3RD. As outlined in the uniform letter signed by each parent, the uniform must be returned clean, in good condition, and on time in order to qualify for a full refund.

1. The jersey must be washed clean of mud and dirt, stains removed, and any tears sewn.
2. The helmet must be scrubbed inside and outside of all dirt and marks, your number and light stripe must be peeled off, and the shell polished. Do not use a metal scrubbing pad!
3. The chin strap, helmet pads, and all helmet clips and screws must be intact.
4. Anything damaged or missing must be paid for, and there are also deductions for dirty or late returns.

A full refund for the Cadet jersey is \$10.00, and the Prep and Tribe refund is \$20.00. After Dec. 3rd the uniform is late, and Cadets are then eligible for a \$7.00 refund and Prep and Tribe players a \$15.00 refund up until Sat. Dec. 10th. After that date, you forfeit the entire amount and will be billed for the uniform. Please be responsible in returning everything and save us a lot of extra time and money.
