
### NBC CLOSED FRIDAY

UNIFORM RETURNS START SATURDAY! FULL REFUNDS GIVEN UNTIL DEC. 1ST



Players must return NBC's football uniform for a refund between SATURDAY, NOV. 24TH AND SATURDAY, DFC. 1ST: As outlined in the uniform letter signed by each parent, the uniform must be returned clean, in good condition, and on time in order to qualify for a full refund.

- 1. The jersey must be washed clean of mud and dirt
- with stains removed and tears sewn. The helmet must be scrubbed inside and outside of all dirt and marks, your light stripe munt be peeled off (please leave numbers on), and the shell is to be polished. Do not use a metal scrubbing pad or abrasive cleaner:
- The chin strap, helmet pads, and all helmet slips and screws must be intact.
- Anything damaged or missing must be paid for, and there are also deductions for dirty or late returns.

A full refund for a Codet jersey is \$10, while the Frep, Tribe and Teen is \$20. After Dec. 1st the uniform is late and Cadets are fined \$3.00 while the older leagues are fined \$5.00. After Dec. 8th, you forfeit the entire amount, are taken off of the active list and billed for the uniform. Please be responsible in returning everything and save us a lot of time and expense.

Also, don't forget that many of you checked off the box on the uniform letter to use your refund as a part of your yearly family donation to NBC. If there are any fines or other deductions, that reduces the amount of your donation. The yearly Family Support donation is \$36.00 for one boy and \$18.00 for each additional boy. Thanks to all who chose this method. It is not too late to donate if you did not check off the box - just tell us at uniform return!


