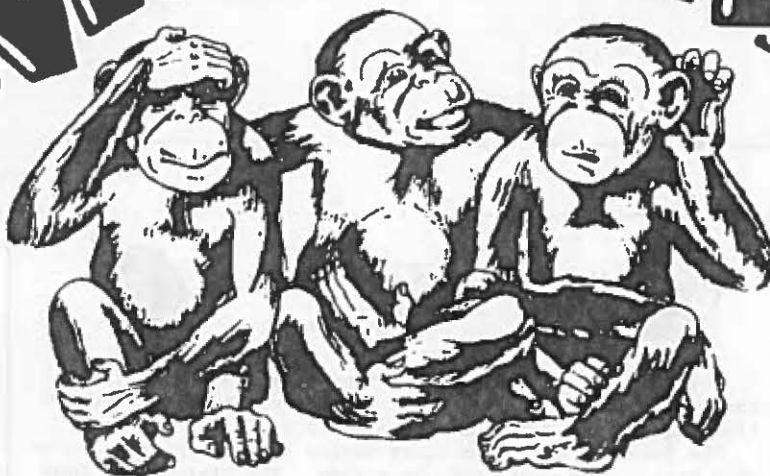

★ UNIFORM RETURNS START SATURDAY! FULL REFUNDS GIVEN UNTIL DEC. 1ST ★

Players must return NBC's football uniform for a refund between SATURDAY, NOV. 24TH AND SATURDAY, DEC. 1ST: As outlined in the uniform letter signed by each parent, the uniform must be returned clean, in good condition, and on time in order to qualify for a full refund.

NBC CLOSED FRIDAY

The Club will be closed all day on Fri. Nov. 23rd to clean up from Thanksgiving and to get things ready for the hockey games and start of uniform returns on Saturday. We open at 8:30 a.m. on Sat., Nov. 24th with a full schedule of games. Be sure to bring your team shirt or \$4.00 to buy one, a cup and clean, dry gym shoes. Uniform numbers will be sold next week and are needed by Sat. Dec. 1st.

1. The jersey must be washed clean of mud and dirt with stains removed and tears sewn.
2. The helmet must be scrubbed inside and outside of all dirt and marks, your light stripe must be peeled off (please leave numbers on), and the shell is to be polished. Do not use a metal scrubbing pad or abrasive cleaner!
3. The chin strap, helmet pads, and all helmet slips and screws must be intact.
4. Anything damaged or missing must be paid for, and there are also deductions for dirty or late returns.

CADET AND PREP MEETINGS AND HOCKEY CAPTAIN VOTING MONDAY!

All Cadet and Prep hockey players should be sure not to forget about their meetings on Mon. Nov. 26th. This game is the key matchup of the day between the two best teams in the league. The champion Bobcats (10-1-) did not have a dominating team talentwise as their record indicate. The Falcons (4-4-4) have as much raw talent as the Bobcats. The difference is that the Bobcats' success can be attributed to their hard work at practice at mastering coach Bob Banty's offense. The Bobcats beat the Falcons 3 of 4 games. The one Falcon win was their high point of the season, a 12-0 win. The biggest thing holding the Falcons back was lack of attendance at practice and showing up late for games. They were unable to run a precision offense, showing only sparks of explosiveness. In spite of their skill, no team wins without the blocking of the offensive line and the Bobcats feature A-A Ricky Munoz, Edward Cruz, Sam Pagan, Tim Selgrat and Sergio Olmos. Blocking backs Julius Romasanta and Ken Monarrez also perform well. The defensive line boasts the strengths of Mike Higgins, Jose Castillo, Tony DelCampo, and Robert Peterson. Coach Banty calls the plays from the sidelines and his team executes the plays to the letter out of the I and Power I. Those who watch this game will see an incredibly explosive offense balanced by a solid defense. They have registered 6 shutouts in 12 games.

The Falcons alternate A-A Andy Cruz and Geoff Taylor at QB. Andy is a fast runner while Taylor is fast, smart and a slasher. A-A Erik Loza is a very aggressive runner who adds another dimension. A-A Milton Cardenas drops back into the heavyback position often when a pass is called for and also gains large chunks of yardage when he decides to run. Up front on the line are A-A Manuel Saucedo, Leonel Loza, John Zagata, Jose Vazquez, Ray Santana and Chris Oquendo. Joe Lennert leads the defensive line. Coaches Dario Camarillo, Paul Goerner and Tom Stone share the playcalling responsibilities. The Falcon defense is the key to their success. Only big passing plays have hurt the team. They have a good run defense and it will have to do the job if they are to get past the Bobcats. They need to churn out the yardage on offense and if they accomplish this, they can beat the champs!

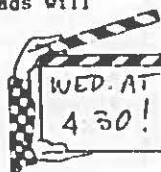
During the indoor season it is important for all members to keep a few things in mind when going over to Revere Park.
