



MEW ADDITION TO LEADER SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

The NBC Scholarship Committee and chairman Pull Flatley, are pleased to announce an addition to the present Leader Scholarship Program.

Under the present program, high school seniors can apply for college scholarships each year. They can earn \$3,000 as freshmen, \$4,000 as sophomares, and 85,000 as juniors and seniors toward tuition at a local college or university while continuing to work part time at NBC. The college scholarships

must be renewed each year.

The new addition will allow incoming freshmen and sophomores to apply for \$500 and incoming junious and seniors for \$1,000 college tultion scholarships. The funds are actually paid to the school once the leader registers for college.

In order to be eligible to apply, a leader must have been working at NBC for at least one year. Applications come out on December 1st and must be submitted by Dec. 31st. The winners for the 1992-school year start applying next week, and will be

announced by February 15th.

In order to be eligible to be a Leade , a member must be about 13 and in about 8th grade. He raid he an active member in good standing, with regular sports participation, good attendance and spert smanship. Leaders are taken on twice each year, during football and basketball, and applications are available at the office.


