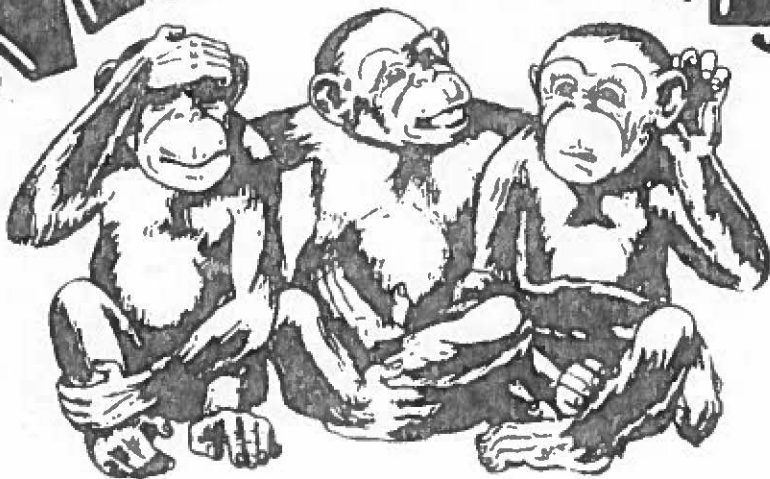

UNIFORM RETURNS START SATURDAY! FULL REFUNDS GIVEN UNTIL DEC. 7TH

Players must return NBC's football uniforms for a full refund between SAT. NOV. 30TH AND SAT. DEC. 7TH. As outlined in the letter your parents signed, it must be returned cleaned, in good condition and on time in order to qualify for a full refund.

1. The jersey must be washed clear of and free of dirt with small tears sewn up. Fines are assessed if someone else has to do the work.
2. The helmet must be scrubbed free of dirt and marks inside and outside and the light strips must be peeled off. Please leave the helmet number on. Do not use a metal scrubbing pad or abrasive cleaner - use a plastic or spongy pad and Soft Scrub. The outside of the helmet must be polished with a floor wax.
3. The chin strap, helmet pads and all clips and screws must be included to avoid fines.
4. Anything damaged or missing must be paid for and will be deducted from your refund.
5. After Dec. 7th, a Prep or Tribe refund is reduced to \$15.00 and a Cadet to \$7.00. After Dec. 7th the entire refund is forfeited. If you fail to provide the equipment your membership will be suspended and we'll pick up or charge you.

Many of our parents have been very generous and agreed to donate their refunds to the Club as a part of the yearly Family Financial Support plan. We ask for a yearly contribution of \$30.00 for a boy, and \$18.00 for each additional child. If you did not check off this option when registering, you can still donate at uniform return. We would appreciate it if, after the holidays, those who donated their refunds could make the rest of the donation. THANKS!

One of the main offensive sparkplugs has been Mario Saucedo, the little runner who came alive in the second half. The potent Viking defense has been led by Guzman and Eloy Flores. The team they'd most like to beat are the Cougars because, "to beat them we would need our heads". The ingredients to the Viking success have been chemistry, enthusiasm, veteran leadership and rookie spirit. The team feels they will come out on top because this will be the last game for many of the vets, who will be going out for high school teams next year. Adding a spark to the defense are Raed Zanaved, Billy Richard, Anthony Feliciano, Mike Tandoc, Ricky Avolar and Erik Aviles. The Cougars were their toughest opponent and want to win the big Turkey Bowl title. Spirit, sportsmanship, coaching and talent have been their strength.

This should be a very tight championship game between two teams evenly matched. Both deserve this title chance and worked very hard to get it. Showing great dedication, attendance and sportsmanship. 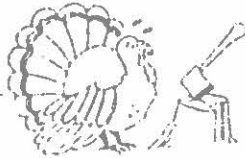

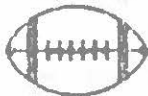

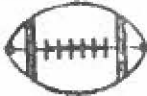

NEW ADDITION TO LEADER SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

The NBC Scholarship Committee and chairman Paul Flatley, are pleased to announce an addition to the present Leader Scholarship Program.

Under the present program, high school seniors can apply for college scholarships each year. They can earn \$3,000 as freshmen, \$4,000 as sophomores, and \$5,000 as juniors and seniors toward tuition at a local college or university while continuing to work part time at NBC. The college scholarships must be renewed each year.

The new addition will allow incoming freshmen and sophomores to apply for \$500 and incoming juniors and seniors for \$1,000 college tuition scholarships. The funds are actually paid to the school once the Leader registers for college.

In order to be eligible to apply, a Leader must have been working at NBC for at least one year. Applications come out on December 1st and must be submitted by Dec. 31st. The winners for the 1992-93 school year start applying next week, and will be announced by February 15th.

In order to be eligible to be a Leader, a member must be about 13 and in about 8th grade. He must be an active member in good standing, with regular sports participation, good attendance and sportsmanship. Leaders are taken on twice each year, during football and basketball, and applications are available at the office.

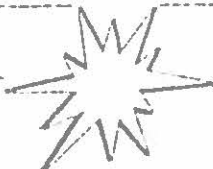
