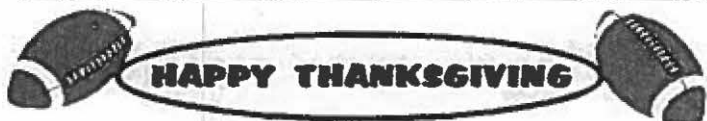

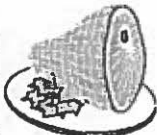

**UNIFORM RETURNS START SATURDAY!
FULL REFUNDS GIVEN UNTIL DEC. 7TH**

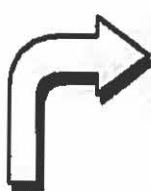
We want to remind our players and parents that the NBGC football equipment must be returned within one week of Thanksgiving. The return dates are from Sat. Nov. 29th through Sat. Dec. 6th. As outlined in the letter signed by parents at the start of the season, the uniform must be returned clean, in good condition and on time to qualify for a full refund or donation credit. This is a busy holiday for all of us, so please don't forget about the uniform. You'll save us a lot of work and we'll enjoy our holiday even more! Thank you for taking care of the uniform.

1. The jersey must be washed clean of mud and dirt with small tears sewn.
2. The helmet must be scrubbed free of dirt and marks inside and outside. The outer shell should be waxed and the helmet number, light stripe and light "L" are to be left on. PLEASE DO NOT USE A METAL SCRUBBING PAD OR AN ABRASIVE CLEANER ON THE HELMET! Soft Scrub is the best cleaner.
3. The chin strap, all helmet pads, all clips and screws must be intact.
4. Damaged equipment or missing parts must be paid for in cash.
5. After Dec. 6th there is a \$5.00 late fine which must be paid in cash. Basketball players must have returned their uniforms before gametime Dec. 6th in order to play that day. In addition we cannot present awards or pictures to anyone who has a uniform out or a fine due.

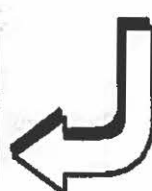

Coach Wilson feels everybody should get a chance at all positions. *The Falcons had many tough games this season. However, out of all the teams they played, the toughest teams were the Bees and the Pirates.* The Bees, no matter what the Falcons did always figured a way to score or stop the Falcons' offense. The Pirates always hung tough when they played the Falcons. All the games this season between these two teams ended up in a deadlock. This Falcon team has improved since the first snap of the season. Their defense became a force to be reckoned with, while the offensive line has stepped up in the blocking department. *Both of the coaches favorite memory is best described in his own words, "Our fondest memory was scoring our first touchdown. It took four games to do it, but when we scored that first, we also scored our second and third touchdowns in the same half."* According to the Falcons, they will win on Thanksgiving Day because they have a better grasp of this game we call Football. The coaches say it best when they wrote, "Why blow it!" This season, the Falcons are 4-0 when everybody show up. If all members of the Falcon's team show up, then the odds of winning become much higher. The Falcons have been coached this year by Brian Wilson and Migual Rojas who have done an excellent job in teaching sportsmanship and hardwork.

The Pirates improved tremendously as the season went by. *Many of the Pirate players never played football before. FIELD 2 - 8:30 AM

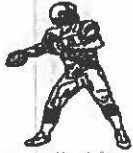

This game features two teams which have *struggled* a great deal throughout the season, but also *learned* a lot from their experiences. The Bees won three of the four games in their series, including the final game of the regular season. The Bees are one of the teams with the best attendance. The Falcons were hurt by players quitting early in the season.

The Falcons struggled the whole year, but they still came out to play each game as hard as they could. They were led by their team captianis Nick Hansen and Eddie Dordies. They won their first and only game against the Bees on October 25th, they ended the regular season with a 1-10-1 record. The tie was against the Cougars where almost had an upset. The Falcons run their offense out of the double tight-end. They have been successful running at the 4 & 5 hole. They mostly run at teams with Vu Ngyuen and All-American Eddie Dordies. Vu is probably the best *sneaky* runner in the league. When the Falcons attempt to pass, the job is handed to Alfredo Rodriguez and his main targets are All-American Nick Delgado, Michael Gibbs, and Tommy Schreiber. All-American Calvin Swan and All-American Javier Alvarez did most of the scoring for the Falcons, and most of the TDs were from the defensive side of the ball. The defensive line had an easy strength advantage over their opponents. The players who have shown the most improvement are Nick Delgado for his overall ability to achieve in any position he is asked to play. Javier Alvarez has improved his overall technique throughout the season. The Falcons were in every game this season, but the toughest losses were to the Pirates. *The Pirates won the game by one big play.* The Falcons most favorite memory was when Javier picked up the fumble against the Pirates to take the lead 6-2, late in the game but still lost with one big play. They expect to win on T-Day because of their, "total domination on both sides of the ball against the Bees throughout the season."

The Bees played hard all season, but fell short when it came down to the nitty-gritty. The Bees have many talented on their team. The team captians were All-American Brian Wright and Pat Walsh. The Bees ended the regular season with a 3-9 recorded. The Bees run their offense out of the I & T formations. The plays that were most effective throughout the season were the down-out-up and sweeps. "One is no better than the other," said coach Adam Taylor of the Bees. He said all of his runners, All-American Anthony Visinaiz, All-American Charles Akers, Matt Henneman, and Damien Ramey, developed the ability to incorporate *speed, power, and cut backs* into their running as the season progressed. The passing duties were divided mostly between Patrick Walsh and Brian Wright. Although Patrick had a lot more responsibilities as starting quarterback, Brian Wright came through when times called for a "goofy lefty's powerful arm." Their go to guys were All-American Sammy Elayan, who has *speed, hands, moves, and determination*, Anthony Visinaiz and Jose Mangual, who has *good eyes and hands*. Sammy led the Bees in touchdowns. The offensive and defensive lines were dominated by Keith Hartman, Timothy Jendry, Ceasar Vasquez, Aaron Federman, Tim Flaherty, Devin Johnson, Brandon Jotzat, Angel Morales, Kenneth Schoenfelt, and All-American Daniel Jenkins. The key area of strength was the whole team playing as one. According to the Bees their toughest opponent was the Pirates, due to their size. Their favorite team memory was coming as close as they did to beating the Pirates, but Coach Taylor's team allowed a kickoff return for a TD. The coach expects victory on Thanksgiving Day because, "We're coming together a little better each game and we have the confidence to win against the Falcons." FIELD 3 - 8:30 AM

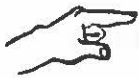



During the late 1970's through the mid-'80's, he worked as a bartender and bouncer at two popular northside bars, Gaffers and 1881. Mike may have served you a drink or two, or thrown you out of the bar.

Mike was a loyal fan of the Bulls, Cubs and Bears. Mike was a part of my Bears season tickets for fifteen years. We were out there on some bitter cold days enjoying every minute of it.

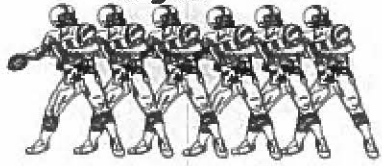

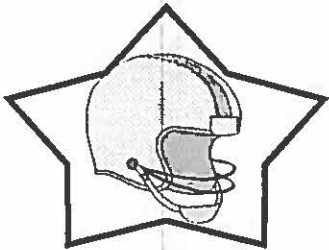

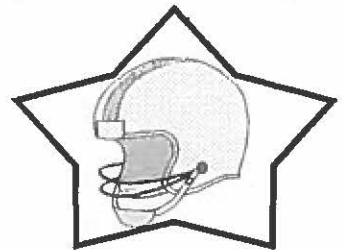
