



UNIFORM RETURNS START NOV. 27TH **FULL REFUNDS GIVEN UNTIL DEC. 2ND**



We would like to remind our players and parents that the NBGC football equipment, soccer jerseys and cheerleading skirts must be returned within one week of Thanksgiving. The return dates are from Mon. Nov. 27th through Sat. Dec. 2nd. As outlined in the letter signed by parents at the start of the season, the uniform must be returned clean, in good condition and on time to qualify for a full refund or donation credit. This is a busy holiday for all of us, so please don't forget about the uniform. You'll save us a lot of work and we'll enjoy our holiday even more! Thank you for taking care of the uniform.

- 1. The jerseys and skirts must be washed clean of mud and dirt.
- 2. The helmet must be scrubbed free of dirt and scuff marks inside and outside. Please leave your light "L" attached. DO NOT USE A METAL SCRUBBING PAD OR AN ABRASIVE CLEANER ON THE HELMET! Soft Scrub is the best cleaner.
- The chin strap, all helmet pads, all clips and screws must be intact.
- 4. Damaged equipment or missing parts must be paid for in cash.
- 5. After Dec. 2nd there is a \$5.00 late fine which must be paid in cash. Basketball players must have returned their uniforms before gametime Dec. 2nd in order to play that day. In addition we cannot present awards or pictures to anyone who has a uniform out or a fine due.

Many of our parents have been quite generous in donating their uniform refunds to NBGC as a part of the yearly Parent Financial Support Program. We ask each family for \$40,00 per year for one child in the program and \$60,00 for two or more. Donations are what keeps the programs running.




TURKEY TOSS RESULTS

RULES FOR USING THE REVERE GYM



Park Supervisor Terry O'Malley asks for the cooperation of our members and parents in using the Revere building and facilities. He would appreciate your compliance with the following rules:

- 1. Only gym shoes are allowed on the gym floor. They must be clean and dry. Try to carry your gym shoes and change downstairs.
- 2. When walking from NBGC to Revere, please use the sidewalk which cuts between the buildings instead of walking through the mud.
- 3. Players are asked not go over to the park more than 15 minutes before the start of their game or practice.
- 4. Everyone is asked to wait in the balcony until the current activity ends, rather than to sit or stand on the stairs, around the lobby or downstairs.
- 5. All of your belongings are to be kept in a locker downstairs, or by your parent or friend in the balcony. Coats, caps, clothing, etc. are not allowed in the gym or gym lobby. It is a good idea to bring a lock as NBGC and Revere will not be responsible for lost or stolen items.
- 6. Food, pop, candy, gum, etc. are not allowed in the gym or balcony. Noise in the balcony must be kept to a minimum. Spectators who are negative toward the officials or any team will be asked to leave.
- 7. Misbehavior will not be tolerated in the Fieldhouse. The park staff can have you leave the building and miss your activity if you get out of hand.
- 8. Please do not leave the back door of the fieldhouse open.

NBGC YouthNet News By Lisa Bodey

Good news! The Neighborhood Boys & Girls Club has been refunded for the 19th District YouthNet program in 2001. The Chicago Department of Human Services sponsors YouthNet and currently there is one YouthNet in each police district. Each program is partnered with a community-based organization, which provides guidance and fiscal management (in our case that's NBGC).

YouthNet was created to provide and link a network of services and programs for young people in our community. It was also created to provide resources and assistance to local agencies and to develop a strong referral system for youth. Over the last year and a half, we have worked hard to continue to build the strong network that NBGC has established in the community. These partners include, but are not limited to: Revere Park, Chicago For Youth, 19th District Police, CAPS, Alderman Schulter, Senator Madigan, State Representative McKeon, Chicago Youth Agency Partnership, Ravenswood, Northcenter and Lakeview Chambers of Commerce, Ravenswood Community Council, Ravenswood Hospital, Cook County State's Attorney's Office, Cook County Juvenile Court, Chicago Public Schools and private schools, University of Illinois Extension, Cambodian Association, Christopher House and many youth serving agencies throughout the city. As you can see, many partners are involved with the success of the youth enrolled in NBGC programs and YouthNet will now work to further expand and nurture our network throughout the district.

Our staff will continue to promote the positive youth development approach, which focuses on the assets of young people and not their problems. This also means that we view young people as partners in our decision making process and we empower them to identify and act upon the problems of our community. Here's a glimpse of our focus for 2001:

- Create a community-wide vision for and a positive image of youth
- Create an awareness and interest in youth issues in our community
- Promote youth worker certification and professionalism in our field
- Develop a staff of adults and youth highly trained in positive youth development
- Increase the number of and quality of peer led programs
- · Complete a community needs assessment based on youth programs and services
- Create a community directory of youth agencies, employers, and other "youth-friendly" establishments in our area
- Develop stronger youth/adult relationships and a community of young people educated about their legal rights
- Develop standards or "best practices" in our field and increase the sharing of this knowledge amongst agencies
- · Educate our community and our elected officials on legislation affecting youth
- · Create a strong referral system and network of services for youth

One of the things that will shift as we work on this new focus is the level of direct service that our staff can provide. We will no longer be coordinating and facilitating programs, but will instead begin to identify gaps in services and will work with agencies throughout the district to build their capacity. We will continue to facilitate a community-wide Youth Council and committees as well as hire and train youth staff. In order to head in a new direction, we need to create a new expanded image for YouthNet. Many folks are unaware of the work that we are doing on a local and citywide level on behalf of youth and we need to get that message out!

We have established a strong Community Advisory Board that is made up of many respected leaders in our community and we will continue to look to them for guidance and vision. It is also time for us to increase our communities' participation on this project through committee work. We are looking for adults and youths interested in serving on a Marketing/PublicRelations Committee, a Resource Development/Fundraising Committee and a Program/Events Committee.
