Wednesday, December 23, 2015 was Tom Krier's last day as NBGC's Executive Director. Tom's NBGC journey did not end on that day, it will evolve into a new opportunity as a SUPER DUPER Volunteer! Tom was born to NBGC as the son of a founding member. He grew up in the shadow of the Clubhouse watching and waiting for his opportunity to join. In the 60's he became a member of the Wasps, then joined the Leader Program, became a Staff Member, then a Board President. Before long he became a parent and coach. Each summer he was on the Fest grounds as our finance chair.

Prior to Tom becoming our Executive Director he was the CFO for Arrow Messenger Services. His extensive knowledge of finances and corporate management has served the NBGC well. Under Tom's leadership, the NBGC has flourished and has a strong Financial Plan for the future of our organization. Each program offered was analyzed to be sure we were meeting the needs of the youth and families and staying true to

our Mission. The hard decisions of changing Legacy Programs like tackle football and baseball were carefully decided on so that we could maintain the legacy and evolve the program to fit the needs of our current families. Eliminating the Family Festival was a tough decision for everyone. But once again Tom stepped up to the challenge. Being a part of the Fest Committee for over 30 years he never realized what a strain the Fest put on the Staff and Leaders. The years of having an excess of volunteers to man the 450+ shifts was long gone. With the removal of the Fest and other events, the staff and leaders have time to focus on enhancing current programs and establishing new ones like the Cleveland and Bateman Afterschool Programs.

But most of all, Tom was a Mentor. He created a collaborative team environment that allowed for creativity and engagement. He always took the time to seek out the members and parents to be sure we were meeting our goals to serve their needs.

So we say Goodbye to Tom the Executive Director, but not to Tom the Leader. At NBGC, we just evolve into a new role and begin a new journey... Thank you Tom Krier for your Leadership to the NBGC Community, Youth, Leaders and Staff. The Clubhouse is a better place because of YOU! The Executive Committee of the Board of Directors is in the process of looking for a replacement. From December 26, 2015 – January 2, 2016, Bonnie Werstein took six fortunate Youth leaders and one Staff member to the Everglades National Park for a week of paddling, camping and personal exploration. The leaders ranged from 14 – 18 years old. **Jae'Leen Torres, Natalia Rueda Marshall, Julianna Hasselberger, Karlie Kielnik, Liam Hudson, Vicky Rueda Marshall and Sergio Arroyo**, share their personal experiences as noted in the following combined excerpts:



With the generosity of the Neighborhood Boys and Girls Club and Chicago Voyagers, I, along with other leaders, was able to participate in a one of a kind trip to the Everglades. On the Everglades trip I learned that there are many different types of leadership, such as being a role- model, a dictatorship and a democratic leadership. Each day on the trip there was a different leader. Everyone on the trip was able to learn new leadership skills like communication and learning to take initiative which is going to help us help the club out and make it better. The trip allowed me to further, and create new friendships, and gave me memories that will stick with me forever...like hilarious tent talks, motivational cheers while canoeing, and our interesting car rides. Despite the fun it seemed like every day we faced new challenges and obstacles, but with perseverance and teamwork we ended the day satisfied with what we had accomplished. One of the things that I could say about this Chicago Voyager's trip to the Everglades was that it was definitely one of the most physically and mentally challenging experiences of my life. From our canoe getting tipped over in pitch black, to washing up on a beach full of mosquitoes and other nasty bugs, this was just what happened on the first day. We all taught each other so much. Whether it was how to do something at our campsite, or teaching each other how to be a better leader in some shape or form, we were all role models for one another throughout the entire trip.



One of the things that I loved was that we brought ourselves to step out of our comfort zones and we were able to do things that we never thought possible for ourselves before it was necessary. However, despite all of the bug bites and sunburn, this was a fantastic trip overall. We laughed, cried, and at some instances got extremely frustrated, but all of this was worth it for the end result. As the days went by we faced many more challenges that could have set us back, but being the strong leaders we are, we were able to overcome all of them. Throughout this trip we developed a better definition of what it truly means to be a leader, and that it takes more than one person to be a successful one. This trip was filled with so many fun and exciting things such as being attacked by flying fish, paddling into the sunsets, and dealing with the strong winds. For me, this trip helped me realize that you shouldn't focus on just the destination, but to focus on the setbacks, accomplishments, and memories you make that get you to it. From the beautiful warm days, starry nights, and late night campfire discussions, my

favorite part by far was the opportunity to get to know and bond with all of the other leaders and guides that were on the trip. Everlasting friendships were made and memories that I will take me for the rest of my life. We all learned something new about ourselves. Some of us gained the confidence that we were missing. Some realized that they were strong leaders but needed a little push to help them show it to everyone. While we did learn about ourselves on the trip, we still learned great outdoor skills, from starting a fire to learning different canoe strokes. We were all able to overcome all obstacles that crossed our path, no matter how difficult they were. I know that we will look back on this trip to see how much we have grown and learned and just to remember what a great time we had.

Bernie Rupe, the Chicago Voyagers' Program leader, has been working with the Club's leaders for over ten years now, providing a variety of outdoor adventures to help the youth grow in leadership and build community. "Those were the goals on our expedition, too, as we had four new senior leaders as part of the group. As always, it was a pleasure. Together, we overcame 2'-3' seas, bugs, 10-15 knot winds, a lost camp site, bugs, travel delays, booked camp sites, and did I mention bugs? All of the teens rose to the challenge, stayed positive and gave their all – proving that success is not measured by challenges, but the ability to rise above them."

Fall Football and Soccer

The Pep Rally on Wednesday night kicked off the festivities as all 34 teams, their coaches, and parents came together to celebrate their season, show off their team banner & pride, and make predictions to get pumped up for their game the following morning. The NBGC Cheerleaders, parents, and fans lined the sidewalk as the teams gathered and ran out to the field for their game once their team was called, smashing through their proudly made banner along the way of course. Three fields were full of games simultaneously from 8:00 in the morning until 2:00 in the afternoon as all the teams battled it out on the field before coming inside to enjoy pastries, hot chocolate, coffee, and walking through the halls of NBGC looking at all of the old pictures and the history past Turkey Bowls.

Basketball

The basketball season has come and gone with a flurry of kids and teams in another exciting winter season. We had 64 teams this season from Kinder-8th grade utilizing all the space in both the NBGC and Revere Park gym as well as the new practice room next to the gym in NBGC. The kids had a fun filled season playing multiple games each week and making the most of all of their playing time. The youth leaders and staff ran nearly 400 hundred basketball games for the kids throughout the season as they were very busy working on their knowledge of basketball rules and officiating skills. The basketball achievement contest was held over winter break for all of the youth playing basketball to come in and compete against fellow players in their league for the right to be called Miss or Mr. Basketball 2015.

After School and School Breaks

NBGC after school programs continue to thrive and play a big role within our community. The after school programs allow for our families to not have to rush out of work to get to their kids on time but it allows our young members to spend extra time with their friends while still getting homework done and enjoying their out of school time. As our afterschool programs continue to grow this fall we opened up new doors at Bateman elementary. We have been on site since November and we cannot be happier with this new partnership. Bateman has been extremely accommodating and it has truly become another home away from NBGC home. Our afterschool programs continue to allow our members to participate in our athletic program as time is never an issue when its game time. Any child that has a game or practice gets walked over from Bateman, Cleveland or Coonley in order to make sure that they are always in attendance. Walking our kids over allows participation in everything that NBGC has to offer and we wouldn't have it any other way. Well... with the exception of a van! Our after school programs continue to thrive and our numbers definitely speak for themselves! Coonley has an amazing 205 members registered, Bateman started with 12 kids and is now sitting pretty at 51 overall members and the NBGC afterschool program remains steady with 54 registered members not including our day off school drop ins. Winter break this year was a success as we had 95 kids registered with an average of 60 kids in attendance daily. We had an amazing time at Brookfield zoo as we were able to take in the dolphin show and see the different trees from around the Chicagoland area. Pump it up of course is always a hit and the kids jumped their way into 2016. Winter break was an overall success and we are already planning on how we can make it even bigger for next winter. As we can't wait until the cold is gone planning for Spring and Summer break are in full effect and we cannot wait to put the final details into our calendars!

A new group of NBGC Youth Leaders have arrived! The newest addition to our leader team graduated from their training in December right before the holidays. During the training, some of the topics that were covered included: counter operation and how to monitor the gameroom, after school program procedures, basketball score marking and officiating, and a lot more.
