Of the many memories shared by Neighborhood Boys & Girls Club members throughout the eras, the greatest is the impact made on their lives by the most “senior leader” of their generation. Robert Buehler...Dick Valentin...Rich Brandon AND Jim McNulty touched the lives of so many young people.

It is with great sadness that the club is now without all four. Only seven short months after losing Rich Brandon, we now grieve the loss of Jim McNulty. Jim passed away suddenly in mid-September. As the shocking news was heard, members from around the world shared their heartfelt memories of his days at the NBGC (see page 5).

Jim became a Cougar in 1965. In 1972 he joined the Leadership Program, serving as a Youth Leader and a Staff Member until 1981. He was appointed Program Director in September 1981 and was appointed Executive Director in 1991, leading the organization until 2012.

An “Everyone Plays” Memorial will be held in honor of Jim at the clubhouse on Sunday, October 18th, starting at 1pm for a meet and greet, followed by a service at 2pm. We encourage everyone to bring gym shoes or spikes for a day of friendship, sportsmanship and teamwork. The Clubhouse will be open until the last ball is caught.
