REMEMBER N.B.C.'S "19" ON VETERANS DAY!

The football program on MONDAY, NOVEMBER 11th will again be dedicated to the memory of the 19 former N.B.C. boys who made the supreme sacrifice in the last world war.

Their sacrifice was made so that you boys could continue to live in the American Way. Those nineteen took part in the same activities as you; they held weekly meetings, played in tournaments, and on the gridiron showed their fighting spirit and sportsmanship by playing under any and ALL conditons. It was their spirit in the early days of N.B.C. that prompted Mr. Robert Buehler, founder of the Club, to develop the N.B.C. into a permanent organization.

Those nineteen played on Armistice Day (now known as Veterans Day) not too long ago and stood at attention while paying their respects to the men who made the sacrifice in the first world war - - NOW IT'S YOUR TURN TO PRAY FOR THEM!

At a given signal at 11:00 A.M. every boy in the park should face east with his helmet or cap in hand, and head bowed in prayer for N.B.C.'s "19". We know that if those "19" could look down at Revere Park, they'd surely feel that their sacrifice was not in vain.

TEAM LEAGUE

In the Team League all three games ended in ties. This does not change the standings, but does show how well balanced all the teams are. The first game was played between the Purple Panthers and the Bucos. This battle featured three long pass plays which went for touchdowns. The Bucos scored first on a tremendous 80 yard pass play from Fabry to Cutinello. In the second quarter the Panthers tied the score on a pass from Hamor to Ray Kramer. The half ended in a tie, but late in the third quarter lightning struck again. Rich Fabry threw another T.D. pass to Fox which covered about 60 yards. This made the score 12 to 6. At this point the Panthers rallied. They drove down the field to the 1 yd. line from where Ricky West carried over for the score. This was the final score as the game ended in a 12 to 12 tie. The second game was a defensive battle in which the Wasps and Bumblebees fought to a 0 - 0 tie. Neither team was able to move the football as both lines charged very hard. The final game was between the fifth place Bobcats and the sixth place Eagles. The Bobcats opened the scoring as Leonard Schutz caught a pass and raced 50 yards for a T.D. The Bobcats defense then took hold and it looked as though they had the game on ice until late in the fourth quarter. The Eagles managed to move the ball down to the Bobcats six on a series of runs and passes. Joe Ziegler then took the snap from center and darted up the middle for the tally. Final score Bobcats 6, Eagles 6. The most important reason for the three ties is the fact that not one extra point was made in any of the games.

SPIDERS WIN FIRST GAME

The Spiders capitalized on a pinpoint air game and the absence of Kevin Mo Guire to down the Dragons 13 to 0. Mike Congoran hit on two T.D. passes as the Spiders won their first game of the season. The Dragons, fresh from upsets of the Wasps and Hornets, showed little on offense and sorely missed Mo Guire. The Spiders kicked off, stopped the Dragons on downs and drove 50 yards for a touchdown. It happened that quick as the Spiders moved remarkably well against the usually tough Dragons. Mike Mo Namara was on the receiving end of three passes, including the touchdown pass on this march. Ed Donahue hit Mac in the end zone on a roll-out pass for the extra point. After this sudden outburst both teams were stopped until the third quarter when the Spiders started another drive, but it stalled on the Dragons 15. Late in the same quarter, they started another drive which carried to the 19 yard line as the 3rd quarter ended. Another pass to Mo Namara got a first down on the two yard line. Then the Spiders made a mistake by calling for a pass. Donahue threw right into the arms of two Dragons who dropped the ball. After another incomplete pass Congoran was dropped back on the nine yard line. On fourth down, Congoran again was called back to pass. He threw the ball directly over Jim Reid's head and Jim made a great fingertip catch and stumbled into the end zone for the score. Don Illing broke up the extra point pass but the contest ended there. The Spiders looked like a fine team, especially on defense with 1 fumble recovery and 2 intercepted passes to their credit. The Dragons were handicapped with the loss of Kevin Mo Guire and are ready to start in again on the upset string which they had broken with this loss.

BOBCATS RUN OVER LEOPARDS

The Bobcats with a good defense and a hard-hitting defense overwhelmed the Leopards by a score of 14 to 0. In the first quarter after Bruce Stake carried the ball to the four yard line he plunged across for the touchdown and the extra point. There was no more scoring until the closing seconds of the third quarter. With Stake and Davis carrying through the middle and around the ends the ball was moved down to the one inch line where Rich Davis promptly carried the ball over for the score. The Leopards finally made a threat late in the 4th quarter when Frank Tierhild carried the ball down to the Bobcats 4 yard line. This is when

the Bobcat defense went to work. Ed Colletta, Ren Granfeldt, and Gary Marcuson stopped the Leopards on three successive plays. The Bobcats took the ball and started another drive downfield but time ran out. Final score: 14 to 0.
