And rest assured, the past couple of years have allowed us to seamlessly pivot and adapt, while not compromising NBGC's rich tradition of creating Better Men & Women.

Even though we made it through the Covid Pandemic, we now face challenges that one might not have even imagined. Dealing with the national labor crisis has been a challenge recruiting qualified candidates to work in the youth development arena. The mental health crisis our members, their families, and our staff deal with daily is something that NBGC helps alleviate by providing resources and a supportive environment.

Another change is eliminating the digital divide. We have moved our program and special events registrations to an on-line platform. Our members also have technology resources at our Clubhouse and school-based sites to assist with their educational needs. Our Technology Committee has created a new sub-committee called the Archives Committee. Technology Chairman, Bill Pittges, has recruited 3 NBGC Hall of Famers to lead this essential committee: Tom Krier, Peter Maxfield, and Ray Sugrue. Tom, Peter, and Ray have moved full steam ahead with scanning 91 years of archives. Digitizing our Alumni Chatters, Event Program Books, Reporters, Monkeyshines, and pictures, making these items searchable is the goal of the committee. Tom even recruited his wife, Jeanne Hair, and sister, Linda Krier, to assist in this mammoth endeavor. I am thrilled to announce our expansion to another school-based site. We are working with the Linne School Principal, Mr. Gabe Parra, to be the after-school provider of choice at Linne School, 3221 N. Sacramento. This is exciting on many different levels. Not only will the children enrolled at this school have a safe-haven during the most vulnerable time of the day...the out of school time, but they also have additional opportunities to participate in our athletic and youth leadership programs. This allencompassing curriculum helps mold them into Better Men & Woman. The anticipated opening of this location is scheduled for February 2023.

The work our Staff and Board of Directors do on a daily basis is truly life-changing. We could not do it without your support and generosity. Summertime Fun!

Summer Camp

Summer Camp 2022 was one for the books! It was our first full summer back since the start of the COVID-19 pandemic. We welcomed 363 campers over the course of 8 weeks. Our campers enjoyed daily crafts, STEM projects, team building activities, and group games. In addition to our weekly themes and spirit days, each week of Core Camp we learned about one of our NBGC Core Values (honesty, self-reliance, sportsmanship, teamwork, leadership, and lasting friendships.) Campers were encouraged to earn Camp Coins throughout each week with good behavior, participation, and demonstrating our core value of the week. At the end of each week, they redeemed their Camp Coins for snacks and small prizes at our Camp Snack Shack. Sour gum and Beanie Babies were among our most popular Snack Shack prizes.

Over the course of the summer, Voyager and Adventure camps especially enjoyed playing classic camp games like 4-team Capture the Flag and kickball. Meanwhile our Discovery and Explorer camps enjoyed the inflatable slip-n-slide and water balloon fights on Water Day each week. A highlight for staff, leaders, and campers alike was our camp Talent Show, Lip Sync Battles, and bounce house inflatables on the last day of Core Camp. This summer also brought back field trips in full swing. Our campers went on two field trips per week to classic places like Waveland Bowl, Lincoln Park Zoo, and Enchanted Castle. Our campers also explored new field trips to Fleetwood Roller Rink, Urban Air Adventure Park, and Gizmo's Fun Factory. It was the first time a lot of our Discovery and Explorer campers had ever been on a school bus or taken an in-person field trip due to several summers of Covid-19 restrictions. We were thrilled to be able to offer this experience to our campers this summer!



NBGC Out-of-School Programs

Throughout all the challenges of the last few years, NBGC has been here to provide a safe environment for families and support our members to ensure a successful school year. Our staff and leaders are ready and willing to provide daily homework assistance, group games, crafts, STEM projects, and full day care on non-attendance school days. So, as students returned to school this fall, NBGC was ready to welcome our members back to our onsite programs at Bateman and Cleveland, continue to serve Bell and Coonley families through our walking program, and welcome surrounding communities to the NBGC Clubhouse program.

Seeing our members enjoying time with their friends, participating in games of touch football with our staff and leaders, playing on the playground, engaging in an intense game of UNO, or participating in a team-building activity is what makes NBGC a place where everyone can call their home away from home. As we prepare to tackle the rest of the school year, we are excited to continue serving our families and members by practicing our core values, including HONESTY, RESPECT, SELF-RELIANCE, SPORTSMANSHIP, TEAMWORK, and LEADERSHIP. Our leaders and staff work diligently to practice our vision of helping members become "better men & women."











Athletics

In 2022, the Athletic program scored several touchdowns! Tennis clinics continued for the 2nd consecutive year, along with lacrosse clinics, and the summer baseball league expanded to include a 4th-5th grade division. In addition, our Fall Football, Soccer, Cheer, and Karate seasons are currently in full swing, with a total enrollment of 373 participants. The season started in early September and will conclude with our Pep Rally on Friday, November 18th, and Thanksgiving Day Classic on Saturday, November 19th, 2022.

Basketball registration is open, and we are looking forward to continuing our relationship with Horner Park and the Bradley Center as we await the reopening of Revere Field House. Our mission to instill sportsmanship, leadership, and teamwork, while building lasting friendships, is at our core.













Growth is the best word to describe what has been happening in the leader program. Our April leader training saw a massive turnout of 50 leaders in training! October marked the last 8-week training session for the year. The fall training group has 20 Leaders In Training (LITs) working towards becoming leaders in November. These LITs have been eagerly shadowing leaders at afterschool and athletic programs. The next leader training session will be January 13th, 2023, and we hope to continue this incredible growth. Our current leaders have been hard at work leading after school activities and athletics, but we have also made time to play. Leaders helped with the NBGCs Cubs Night Out pre-game cookout and then enjoyed seeing a Cubs game (some for the first time). We also enjoyed two fun adventures with Chicago Voyagers. Leaders joined Chicago Voyagers on a canoeing trip to Busse Woods in August. Leaders learned team building and canoe skills and played fun canoeing games. October brought us to Palos Forest Preserve for a day of mountain biking with Chicago Voyagers. The leaders showed tremendous grit and perseverance as they tackled some challenging trails. Many leaders had never done off-road biking but bravely showed up to try something new. All the leaders on these trips gave these new experiences their absolute best. We are incredibly proud of these teenagers' leadership qualities on both of these trips. 

Construction continues on the Revere Field House

Structures Construction continues work on the Revere Park Field House. There is plenty of work to finish before the project is complete. Masons have been bricking the new elevator enclosure, and the gym floor has been installed, painted, and finished. Other essential infrastructure work will continue over the coming months. Sidewalks were recently removed, including the walkway to the Club House. The walkway from Irving Park Rd to our front door will now be ADA-compliant. Other recent updates include the installation of our bike racks, installation of a new rooftop skylight hatch, and a new concrete pad for our garbage and recycling bins.




