GRID RIVALS CLASH ON THURS.



On Thursday, November 20, the annual Thanksgiving Day Football Program will be held on the three gridirons at Paul Revere Park. Thirteen games are scheduled, beginning as early as 8.00 A.M. and on each succeeding hour six different teams will take over. Every member of the twenty-six clubs is prepared to play the greatest game of his life, and the boys are on edge for the opening kick-off. A public address system will be used to announce the starting lineups, the final scores, and the highlights of the various games. College songs will be heard between quarters. Everything has been done to make this Thanksgiving Program as successful as last year's, and now it's up to you boys to take care of your end of the program. Get your team ready to play at least 15 minutes early, and make a special effort to bring your parents and friends out to the game. A synopsis of each team will show what is in store for the spectators in the way of thrilling games.

GRIDIRON #1

8:00 A.M. - WINGS VS TIGERS

In the opening encounter of the day, two teams who are neighborhood rivals will meet. Both the Wings and the Tigers are still holding a grudge, due to their earlier meetings this season. The Wings, who are tied for first place, must win this one to stay on top, while a victory for the Tigers would move them into the thick of the championship fight. Nothing would please the Tigers more than to knock their enemies out of the top rung in the Prep Division. The Wings are led by Denny Manning in the line, and by their hard-driving halfback, Bob Holm. Gordy Falknor is one of the best pass-receivers in the league, and can really travel once he grabs the pigskin. The Tigers rely on Lou Beucher and Fred Strantz. Beucher is an outstanding tackler and Strantz is a plunging fullback, who accounts for most of his team's yardage. It will be worth your while to miss a little sleep to watch these boys play.

9:00 A.M. - EAGLES VS SPARKS

The Regular Division's first game features the Eagles and Sparks. The Eagles have revived after a slow start and are determined to get out of the cellar by using the Sparks as a stepping-stone. The Sparks want to make amends for their poor showing in their last game with the Eagles and are out for blood. The fleet-footed Colin Gordon is the mainspring in the Eagle offense, while Frank Schweiding and Merle Richmond carry the load on defense. 10:00 A.M. - PIONEERS VS DEMONS

The two most evenly-matched elevens in the Regular League come face to face in this skirmish. The Demons are in first place and, but for a defeat and a tie at the hands of the Pioneers, would have a perfect record. The Pioneers are in second place and absolutely need this game to remain in the running. The Demons' strong line, led by Petty and Both, is expected to open huge holes for Pernice, Oetjens and Stecz to drive through. Besides a hard-to-stop running attack, the Demons have some tricky pass maneuvers. The Pioneers have three fine linemen, Rottman and the Kochler boys, and a sensational backfield. When Kost, Klein, Hohmeier and Nealis are clicking, there isn't a set of backs in the N. B. C. to compare with them. This will be a wide open match.



GRIDIRON - #111:00 A.M. - ARMY VS NAVY

For the second consecutive year, the Army and Navy come down to the final gun neck and neck. The two friendly enemies have been an even match all season and on Thanksgiving, the tie will be broken. In three previous encounters each team has a victory, and one game ended in a scoreless tie. Both teams play spectacular offensive football, with the Navy boasting an edge in line play and the Army being superior in the backfield. The Navy has Tom Donley, the "one man line", to spark its play with McDonough, Derron, and Geib to help him. The Army line is led by Rosenkranz, and Anderson and their backs, Nordgren, Stapleton, Lewis, and Phillips, are all fast and deceptive. This will be a close one!

12:00 NOON - MIDGETS VS BEARS

The two teams who have improved so vastly in the last few weeks, the Midgets and Bears, will fight it out to determine which is the champ of the "hard-luck" teams. Neither has had a very successful season but a Thanksgiving victory will make up for earlier losses. The Midgets have a weak line, but they have a trio of standout backs in Meyers, Hilfman, and Young. The Bears are paced by Haag and Taylor in the line, and by the Hutmakers and Franke in the backfield.

GRIDIRON - #29:00 A.M. - YANKEES VS COMETS

The "Darkhorse" Yankees hope to gain revenge for a defeat at the hands of the Comets last Thanksgiving by whipping them in the opening tilt on field 2. The Yankees have come from the cellar and in a thrilling display of courage have won eight consecutive games after losing their first four starts. They are determined to continue their victory march to the season's conclusion. The Comets have other ideas however, and will give everything they've got to continue on the way to their second consecutive football title. The Yanks have a terrific line with Schroeder, Terp, Windschell, and Howard all being hard blockers and tacklers. Their small backfield is led by "Dashing Don" Coope. This is sure to be a hard-fought game!

10:00 A.M. - PANTHERS VS RAIDERS

The Raiders, now the possessors of the best record in the Prepper League must cop this game to stay ahead of the Bats and Panthers. The Raiders opened the season with an 11 game winning streak, but the Bats put a 6 to 0 beating on them and prevented them from going into the Thanksgiving Day game unbeaten. The Panthers now hope to push the Raiders further from an undefeated season, and Jim Reed, Warren Jacobsen, and Ronny Rose all promise to make the game a runaway. The Raiders, led by their all-star quarterback, Clif Farrell, want to get back into the win column. Clif, who is a real triple-threat star, is the leading scorer in the entire N.B.C. as he has tallied more than 150 points since the season began. Kessler and Chirchirillo are the best men in the Raiders' line.

11:00 A.M. - RAVENS VS SOX

The outcome of this game may decide the champion of the Frosh "B" league. The Sox are one game ahead of the Ravens and so both teams want this game badly. The Sox hold a slight edge in previous games, but the Ravens, possessors of one of the most intricate offenses in the N.B.C., believe they can turn the trick just as they did in the season's opener.
