CHECKER TOURNAMENT RESULES

Last Friday night 28 Prep leaguers and 11 Tribe leaguers participated in the first of four checker tournaments that will be held throughout the Friday night tournaments. After the completion of the four checker tournaments, there will be a "Tournament of Champions." To be eligible to participate in this "Tournament of Champions" in checkers you must accumulate at least 6 points during the four tournaments that will be held. When you come to the tournament you are placed in a bracket with 7 other boys. The tournament is a double elimination tournament, meaning, if you lose 2 games you are out of that tournament for that night. You receive your points by placing 1st, 2nd, 3rd or 4th in your bracket only! 1st place boys will receive 5 points, 2nd place 3 points, 3rd place 2 points and 4th place get 1 point. Remember, you need an equivalent of 6 points or better to be eligible for the "Tournament of Champions."
