N.B.C. BOYS BENEFIT

Boys Benefit books will be given out to all active members this Saturday morning, April 12th, in the Camerom. It is very important that each team have two representatives on hand to pass out the books to all of their teammates. These reps were chosen and signed up during last weeks meetings. You must pick up your books between 9:00 and 9:15 AM. Be sure that you are here on time, because the team rep will be out selling their tickets after 9:15. No team will receive books unless they have two reps! You may pick up additional books and turn in money until 4:00 PM on Saturday.

WHY IS IT CALLED BOYS BENEFIT?

We call this the "boys Benefit" because you benefit from selling the chances. Your "Benefit" depends upon your own enthusiasm towards the selling of chances. You determine exactly how many points and prizes you will earn! You will receive 25 points for each ticket sold.

A "Prize Sheet" will be given out to everyone listing all of the items we have and the number of points needed to get them. Our display room will be open on Tuesday and Thursday, April 29th and 30th.

We are not operating a store. The items given to you for points accumulated are strictly prizes and are not to be measured in dollars and cents.

HINTS FOR SELLING TICKETS

1. Be polite and clean! Go from door to door and have a short sales talk prepared. Always say "Thank you", even when refused. People can not buy chances from everyone!
2. You can sell tickets in any neighborhood, even the suburbs! Friends who live far away can help you sell a few books to their neighbors. Offer them a prize for helping out.
3. Do not miss out on the opportunity of selling tickets in your own neighborhood where people know you and are familiar with the Boys Club. It's easy to sell tickets at 25¢ each. Most raffle tickets now go for \$1.00 to \$1.50! N.B.C. chances are a real bargain!
4. Ask your mother, father, and relatives to help you sell books if they can.
5. Some good selling spots are bowling alleys, shopping centers, food stores, or any places where there are large groups of people.
6. Sell the business people on the idea of winning a calculator. Sports nuts may be interested in winning a set of golf clubs.

TURNING IN YOUR MONEY

1. Money must be turned in between 3:30 and 5:00 PM every day except Saturdays, when it must be turned in between 10 AM and 12 noon.
2. BILLS ONLY--Money must be turned in only in bills! If you have a lot of change, take it to a store and ask them for bills in exchange. If we allowed you to bring change in line, it would take all day and everyone would lose valuable selling time.
3. A receipt will be given to each boy for the amount turned in. These receipts must match the ones in our files. Save your receipts and bring them with you when you come for prizes so that there are no disputes.
4. Prizes will be given out for the first time on Tuesday and Thursday, April 29th and 30th. Good luck!

DART LEAGUE

In the Tribe League playoffs, the matches started off this way in the first bracket : The Bobcats were matched up against the Scorps A team. Even though the Bobcats took a big lead in the match, the Scorps A team led by Frank Giannese did manage to get into striking distance but couldn't capitalize on it. With that win the Bobcats moved up to the next bracket to face the Scorps B team. This was a much closer game than the first match, with the lead trading off very often. MARSHMELLOW WARS

Negotiations got off to a shaky start, with charges and counter charges. The most controversial subject at first was the shape of the negotiating table. President Wayne Scharba and Secretary of State Chris Skelnik refused to compromise on the shape, which was that of two semi-circles, while Prime Minister Rex Pecoraro and Minister of Defense Brian O'Connell wanted a diamond shaped table. Finally after days of intense negotiations a football shaped table was agreed upon.

The next order of business was the release of prisoners, but President Scharba's Secretary of Defense, Paul Flatley, refused, saying that national security would be at stake, but promised that all prisoners would be treated in accordance with the Geneva Convention of 1932. Secretary Flatley denied charges of prisoner mistreatment brought up by Foreign Minister Jim McGuire, who organized many of the daring Commando Raids to release prisoners being held deep behind enemy lines.

More points that are being negotiated are that of a demilitarized zone (DMZ). Informed sources say that if the talks fail, the DMZ will be the point in question. Minister of Welfare Paul Robin was reported to say that "this is the most important point of the negotiations", and Secretary Frank Brandon agreed and also said it must be negotiated. Carl Gobelman, the Minister of Information, said in a television interview yesterday that the DMZ can not be negotiated. Minister Gobelman gave no reason. More facts next week or as they become available.
